EXPLOSION KILLS

George Franklin and Jim Gaddy were both instantly killed at Sunburst Tuesday evening just after six o'clock by the untimely explosion of a charge of dynamite which the two men had planted for blast-(1) Introductory sermon by Eld- ing. There were no eye witnesses of the accident but it is supposed. hat a charge was delayed and that (2) 12. M. adjourned one hour the men went to investigate just as it went off. When other workmen arrived there were only scattered remnants of what had been the two men, scarcely enough to identify them.

The accident occurred on the Middle Prong & operation where the Pigeon River railroad is being constructed by a series of heavy inclines. All the workmen had gone to supper except Franklin and Gaddy who stayed behind to shoot the blasts. At the supper table it was noted that the blasts did not go off together and when the two men failed to show up some of the men went to investigate.

The scene that met their gaze in the dusk of early night beggars description. Covering the earth for many hundred feet around, and caught in the branches of trees were fragments of the tlesh and clothing of what so shortly before had been and live men. Will Franklin identified his father by a bit of skull and hair while it was Wednesday morning before enough of Gaddy was found to be recognized, and this a portion of his belt with a piece of fuse attached that was found in a tree.
