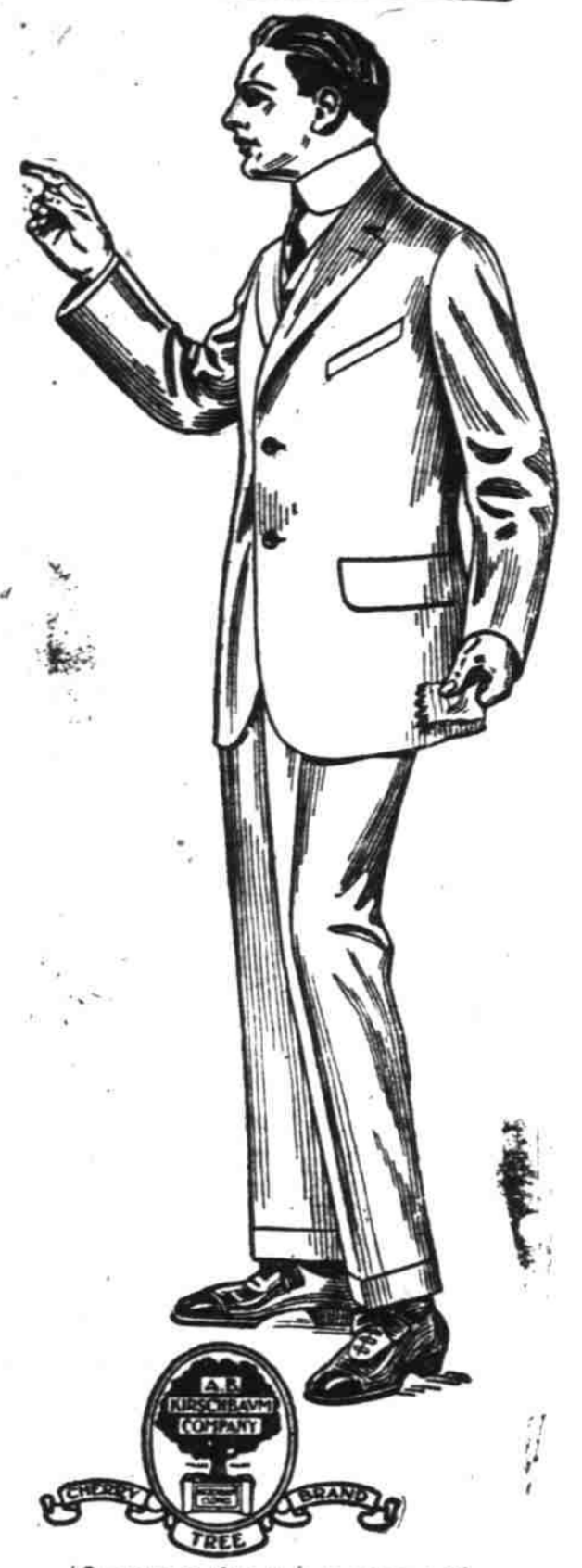

LEGISLATURE MEETS WEDNESDAY

The extraordinary session of the General Assembly which has been called by Governor Craig convenes at Raleigh next Wednesday September 24.

The special commission appointed by the General Assembly at it's regular meeting last winter acting with the North Carolina Corporation Commission has been unable to reach a satisfactory agreement with the railroads and it will be necessary for the special session to fight the matter out with them.

Everybody is interested. The people should write the members of the General Assembly urging them to fight the good fight to a finish and accept nothing short of absolute justice at the hands of the railway corporations.

Another important feature of the extraordinary session will be the consideration of the constitutional amendments that will be submitted to the people for ratification at the polls.
