## 1,600,000 XMAS SEAL COMING.

One million six hundred thousand Red Cross Xmas Seals are on their way to North Carolina. Mr. Leet B. Myers of Charlotte, who is prominent in the sale of the seals in the State this year, has just received notice that this number has been allotted to the State and shipped. If these are all disposed of at one cent each, it will mean \$16,000 to be used in the State in the fight against the Great White Plague, or tuberculosis, which causes the death of 6,000 people in the state each year.

Mr. Myers started on a trip this week to visit all the more important cities to get organized for an aggressive educational campaign and for the sale of these Christmas stamps. The stamps sell for one cent each and are used to stick on letters to show the user's interest in the tuberculosis work, and to ask the interest of the one to whom the package or letter is sent. Banks and business houses use them on all the mail they send out during December. Stores use them on Xmas deliveries, shops on pay envelopes, and every body on all kinds of mail. 400,000 seals were sold last year in the State and it is hoped that we can increase the sales to more than one million this year.

The Postmaster General has issued an order permitting these seals to be sold in the Post Offices. Every community is invited to get the seal and sell them, sending the money to the State Committee to be used in State-wide work. Seals are sent free to be paid for after sold; unsold seals to be returned to headquarters.
