

**COMMERCE MEN  
CALL TEAM WORK  
BIG STATE NEED**

Concentrated effort and team work for the betterment of every attribute of Western North Carolina were the keynotes sounded at the meeting of the Federated Chambers of Commerce of Western North Carolina Friday at the Battery Park Hotel. There were 51 delegates present representing 18 cities of this section and the matters of housing facilities, sports, tours, week end visits, real estate protection, forestry and other subjects were discussed and resolutions passed for action.

In connection with the matter of real estate transactions a resolution was passed urging that real estate boards be organized in all towns in Western North Carolina under plans approved by the National Association of Real Estate Boards with particular reference to the adoption of the code of ethics of the national organization. It was proposed that the real estate boards develop a co-operative arrangement that will prevent conduct or operation not in accord with the realtors' code of ethics.

It was unanimously voted that Western North Carolina enter an exhibit in the Southern exhibition to be held at Madison Square Garden, New York City, in October. The committee appointed to take charge of arrangements is composed of F. L. Adolph, Lenoir; H. B. Corwith; S. T. Henry, Spruce Pine; Horace Kephart, Bryson City; and F. Q. Boyer, of Asheville. The exhibit is planned to cover 2000 feet of floor space in which will be presented the resources, products and

possibilities of Western North Carolina. Private exhibitors who desire to participate are requested to communicate with the Federation secretary, F. Roger Miller, before July the first.

The co-operative advertising committee was elected as follows: G. A. Abbott, Marion; J. E. Stubbs, Hendersonville; C. E. Vaughan, Black Mountain; H. E. Buchanan, Sylva; and L. F. Jackson, of Burnsville. This committee will prepare pictorial letterheads, envelopes, folders and other literature advertising Western North Carolina as its first active work in the campaign and these will be distributed by all organizations and their members.

The Federation voted to publish a booklet that will contain tour routes from various points, points of interest, hotels, highways maps and illustrations. This committee will be composed of F. Roger Miller, Asheville, chairman; E. C. Kingsbury, Franklin; Charles Lynch, Tryon; E. L. Withers, Waynesville; C. M. Sturkey, Lenoir; and G. A. Abbott, of Marion. In connection with the work of this and other committees the matter of fall advertising campaigns to be sponsored by chambers of commerce and other civic organizations of Western North Carolina to develop fall and winter tourist travel and to generally promote business was discussed and plans made. The committee of extension to promote new organization and to extend the federation to take in all counties of Western North Carolina is composed of F. H. Coffee, Lenoir; A. L. Sandidge, Bryson City; W. R. Mehaffey, Tryon; T. A. Wilson, Saluda and J. E. Stubbs, of Hendersonville.

Mr. Rogers made the opening address at the morning meeting which began at 11 o'clock. Mr. Rogers said that it was the purpose of the organization to unite the constructive forces of this section into one great forward movement in which all cities and towns might participate. Luncheon was served the visitors by the Asheville Chamber of Commerce at one o'clock and the meeting adjourned at 4 o'clock.
