HIGHWAY 106

If Jackson county is to continue to grow and expand and progress, the county must increase the value of taxable property. That is obvious. The best way that is now in sight to that end is the development of southern Jackson county, Cashier's Valley, Hamburg, Mountain, Canada those provinces where nature broke her apron-strings and poured out incalculable blessings, and beauty and grandeur. The first step in that development is the building of Highway 106 into one of the great highways of North Carolina.

There lies our duty. There lies our opportunity. There is pledged the promise of the Sylva Chamber of Commerce, of the people of Sylva, and of the state highway commission.

PLAN ROAD MEETING AT HIGH HAMPTON

Mr. E. L. McKee is in receipt of a letter from the secretary of the Walhalla, S. C., Chamber of Commerce, stating that plans are being made for a joint meeting of the highway commissioners of South Carolina and of North Carolina, at an early date, at High Hampton, on the old Sloan Turnpike.

The object of the meeting is to lay before the North Carolina road authorities the plans of the people of the two states for the old Sloan Turnpike to be taken over and placed on the map as a part of the state highway system, and to get surfacing on the South Carolina end of the road.

The Sloan Turnpike, leading from Walhalla to Cashier's Valley, has been renamed the Wade Hampton Memorial Highway and is attracting much comment throughout the southeast as it is designed to shorten the distance from many Southern cities to Cashier's Valley, Sylva, The Great Smoky Mountains National Park, and to Knoxville and Tennessee points.

REPUBLICANS NAME COUNTY TICKET

The republicans of Jackson county met in convention, last night in the court house and named their ticket for the fall campaign.

Cyrus H. Nicholson heads the ticket as candidate for representative. Mont B. Cannon, sheriff, J. T. Gribble, clerk of the superior court, W. W. Bryson, register of deeds, Geo. W. Sutton, judge recorder's court, S. C. Cogdill commissioner of finance, S. M. Parker, commissioner of highways, Thomas Barrett, commissioner of education, R. L. Elder, coroner, and S. M. The old organization was re-elected with John B. Ensley as chairman and Hugh E. Monteith as secretary.

Addresses were delivered by Capt. Kenneth I. Smathers, republican candidate for congress, by Mrs. Smathers, by Geo. Pritchard, Capt. Smathers' campaign manager, McKinley Edwards, manager of the campaign west of the Balsams and others.

The convention was unanimous in condemnation of the absentee voter's law.
