

IN AUTO SMASH

Officers reported finding 12 quarts of liquor in the car, which was practically demolished. No inquest has vet been held.

Jenkins got out of the ear, he said and walked to a house some distance away, where he telephoned for an ambulance to come for Beck.

Beck was employed here with the State Highway commission. He was unmarried.
