G. O. P. LANDSLIDE

An avalanche of Republican votes swept all but one state into the Republican column in Tuesday's election, with the result in some of the remaining states in doubt. Early this morning North Carolina appeared in the blue column with a majority of 2500.

Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, and South Carolina alone remained safely in the red column with Tennessee, North Carolina, Florida, Virginia, and Texas definitely in the Republican column as far as the national ticket is concerned, and likely to remain there until the official tabulation is completed.

GARDNER AND STATE WIN

Max Gardner and the entire Democratic state ticket were elected in Tuesday's election; although the state was apparently in the blue column by a slight margin.

CANVASSING BOARD MEETS

The county canvassing board in all the counties of North Carolina is meeting and canvassing the results of the election throughout the state.

BUNCOMBE GOES REPUBLICAN

For the first time in many years Buncombe county has elected an entire county's Republican ticket, the majority ranging from 200 up to 1000 on the face of the unofficial returns, with the exception of George Dees, Register of Deeds, who was defeated.

SWAIN IN REPUBLICAN COLUMN

Swain county changed from Democratic to Republican, in Tuesday's election, electing an entire Republican ticket.

HAYWOOD GOES FOR HOOVER

Herbert Hoover carried the Democratic county of Haywood.

TRANSYLVANIA AND HENDERSON SPLIT TICKET

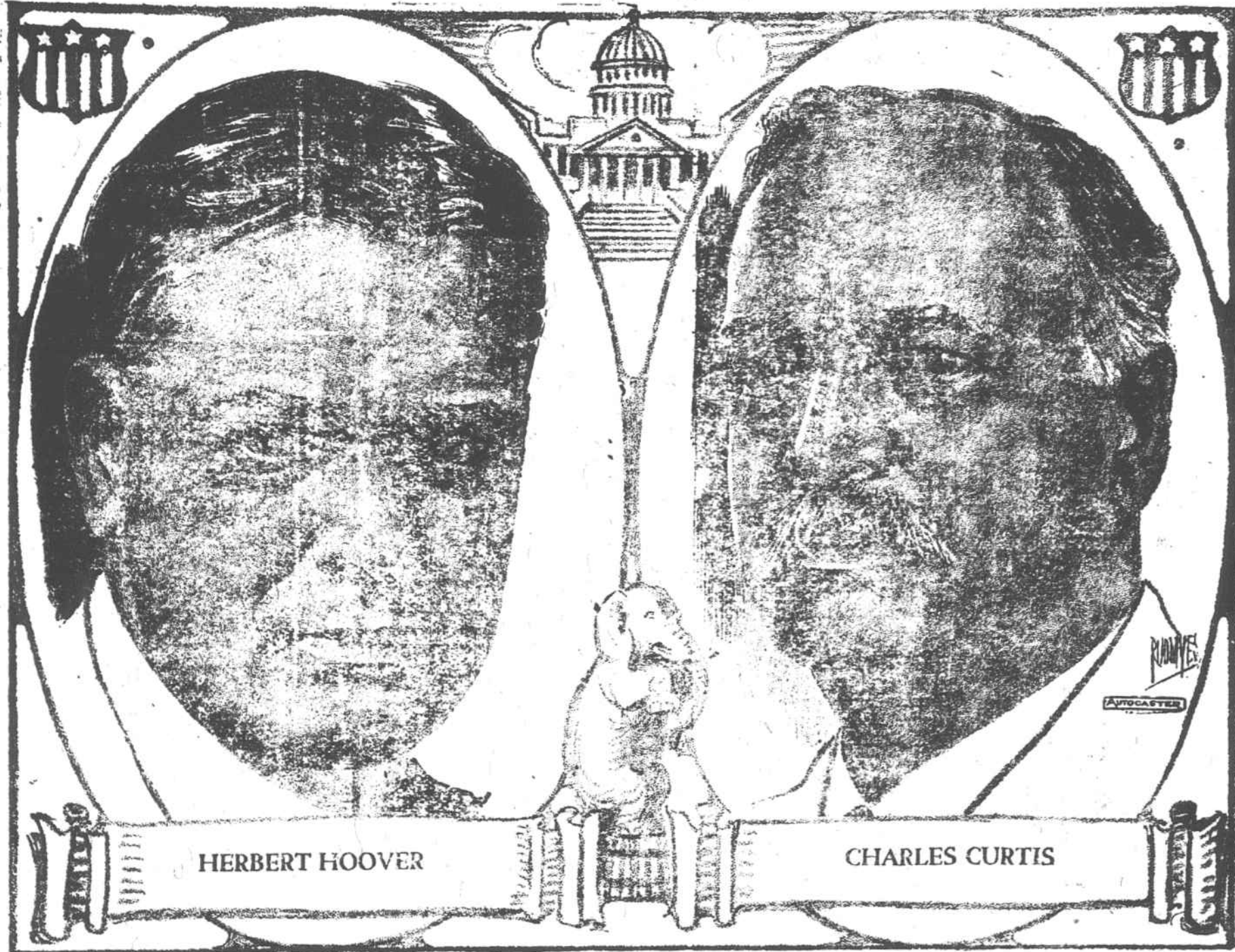
Both Henderson and Transylvania counties elected Democratic sheriffs, but the rest of the officers in these counties are Republican.

J. C. RHODES ENDS LIFE

Concealing himself in his neighbors garage, J. C. Rhodes, citizen of Whittier, ended his life by shooting himself through the heart about 4 o'clock Monday afternoon.

No reason for his act has been advanced by relatives or associates and members of his family are of the opinion that the shooting was accidental, believing that Mr. Rhodes went into the garage to load his gun, and that it was discharged in some manner. There is no reason advanced as to why he should have taken his own life.

Mr. Rhodes is well and favorably known in both Jackson and Swain counties, having lived in Whittier and the lower end of Jackson county for many years. He is survived by his widow, three sons and two daughters.

Funeral services were held yesterday.

ROY BECK KILLED IN AUTO SMASH

Roy Beck, 25 years old, of Bryson City, was instantly killed Sunday evening about 6:30, when the automobile which he was driving failed to make a curve on the Bryson City-Franklin road and turned over. The accident occurred at a point about 11 miles from here.

Beck's three companions, Mr. and Mrs. Bryan Jenkins and Miss Hazel McMahan, were unhurt.

Officers reported finding 12 quarts of liquor in the car, which was practically demolished. No inquest has yet been held.

Jenkins got out of the car, he said and walked to a house some distance away, where he telephoned for an ambulance to come for Beck.

Beck was employed here with the State Highway commission. He was unmarried.
