At the time this edition went to press the tabulation in South Sylva precinct had not been completed; out of a total vote of 896; there were 413 straight Republican tickets, and 398 straight Democratic tickets, which means practically an even break in that ward, cutting the Republican majority in the two precincts in Sylva to near 100.

SNOWY ELECTION DAY
Election day dawned cold and rainy with the higher mountains covered with snow, an snow was blowing intermittently all day in the valleys. It was the most disagreeable election day from a standpoint of the weather in many years.

Cars coming into Sylva from across the Balsams were covered with snow. Regardless of the weather, many voters stood in line all day, at the Sylva voting precincts, awaiting their turns at the ballot box.

One of the most amazing things on the face of the returns of the election of yesterday, was the strong come back of the Democratic party, throughout the country. Two years ago as badly defeated as any major party ever was in the history of the nation, the Democratic party came back with a bang in all parts of the country, and made a splendid showing in every section.

AGED WOMAN KILLED HERE

Miss Florence Finch, 75 years old, died Sunday afternoon in the C. J. Harris Memorial hospital, a few hours after she was injured in an automobile accident on Highway No. 10 a short distance east of the city limits of Sylva.

J. P. Parker of Black Mountain, driver of the car in which Miss Finch was riding, said he was going west on Highway No. 10 just east of Sylva, following another machine. A third car, also headed west, was parked on the Allen Branch bridge, he said. The car directly in front of him swerved around the parked machine and Mr. Parker said he had expected to do likewise, when he suddenly saw a car coming toward him. Unable to stop his car quickly he must either crash into one of the machines or turn off on a side road which leaves the highway at that point.

He attempted to follow the latter course, and the car turned over into the branch. Miss Finch, with Mrs. Parker and Miss Margaret Parker, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Parker, was riding in the rear seat of the machine. Miss Finch's chest was crushed. The other occupants of the car escaped with minor cuts and bruises. Mr. Parker said that he had the license number of the parked machine. He did not make the number public, however, and said Monday he had not decided whether he would ask for an investigation. No plans for an inquest had been made here Monday.

Miss Finch, who had no near relatives, had made her home with the Parkers, her friends, for the past two years. Formerly she had lived in Lincolnton.

It is understood that party, consisting of Mr. Parker, Mrs. Parker, their daughter, Miss Margaret Parker, and Miss Finch, had started to Cherokee for a visit to the Indian Reservation, when the accident occurred. The body of Miss Finch was taken Monday to Black Mountain for funeral and interment.

BAILEY'S MAJORITY OVER 75,000

The face of the returns tabulated in the State at midnight indicated that Josiah William Bailey has swept the State from the Great Smokies to the sea, and that his majority will reach between 75,000 and 100,000. The election of a complete list of ten congressmen in North Carolina is indicated.

THE OFFICERS ELECT

The entire Democratic ticket elected yesterday in Jackson county which will be inducted into office on the First Monday in December is composed of John J. Maney, sheriff, defeating J. M. Worley. Dan Allison, clerk superior court, defeating J. T. Gribble. Vernon L. Cope, register of deeds, defeating W. W. Bryson. J. D. Cowan, commissioner of finance, defeating John B. Ensley. Monroe Madison, commissioner of welfare, defeating J. D. Parker. John Allman, commissioner of roads, defeating Coot Wood. Joseph Hooker, judge recorder's court, defeating E. P. Stillwell. Rogers Coward, surveyor, defeating Sam Cook. Neal Dills, coronor, defeating J. H. Painter. Thomas A. Cox, will represent Jackson county in the next general assembly of North Carolina, having defeated Dr. D. D. Hooper.

DILLSBORO MAN KILLED IN AUTOMOBILE

The funeral of Dewey Sutton, 28, son of Julius Sutton, of Dillsboro, who was killed in an automobile wreck, Friday between Asheville and Canton, was held Monday in Dillsboro with Rev. George B. Cleinax and Rev. W. C. Reed conducting the service.

Sutton died in Aston Park hospital, Asheville, about 10 o'clock Friday night, a few hours after being taken there. He had a badly fractured skull and never regained consciousness after the crash.

W. C. Green, of Canton and Greenlee Anderson of Gastonia, companions of young Sutton, were bruised and cut, but escaped serious injury.

The car in which Sutton was riding, said to have been driven by one of the other men, is said to have attempted to pass another car and meeting another going in the opposite direction, the driver is said to have attempted to stop his automobile; swung off the pavement, and turned over. The accident occurred about 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

S. H. Ballenger of West Asheville, a traveling salesman, who came upon the scene just after the accident, assisted in extriating the injured from the wrecked car and brought Sutton to the hospital. The other two injured men were brought to the hospital on a truck.

HEFLIN DEFEATED IN ALABAMA

Returns pouring in from all parts of the state of Alabama showed that Bankhead had defeated United States Senator Tom Heflin, leading him three to one.

Heflin, former Democrat, deserted the party ticket in 1928 and supported Hoover for president. He was running in the election as an independent opposing Bankhead on the regular Democratic ticket.

GOOD OLD SOLID GROUND
