That is the duty of the courts and juries.

Who can remember, among all the murders that have darkened the record of Jackson county, when a jury bas returned a verdict of murder in the first degree, and he who took the life of man has forfeited his own to the organized laws of man? It has been so long that only the older people can remember when capital punishment was meted out by a Jackson county jury.


