display with the exhibit. This and transplanted the seedlings to 450 two-inch pots. Part of these pots were displayed with the exhibit.

In connection with this exhibit, I prepared leaf prints of all herbs found in the county, and prepared a manual describing them.

Herbs found in these old gardens were not planted last year, nor were they before. They belong to the past. Western North Carolina was the last frontier of our country. The courageous people who here established these gardens many years ago. In their aim to become self-subsisting, they grew their own culinary and medicinal plants. These interesting plants have been handed down from mother to daughter, through many generations.

Herbs found in these gardens were brought over from England, where they had been assembled from the far-flung gardens of the world. As we march down the 'Halls of Memory,' we see the herb-lore is closely associated with the world and people, almost from man's beginning. As I visit old homesteads and become acquainted with herbs having a long-old reputation, it seems that these plants are a sacred heritage of the past. Their uses are intertwined with every step of man's progress throughout the ages.

There is no hobby more fascinating than herb gardening. They may be grown around the border of the vegetable or flower garden, or in a pot. Just of herbs, if you have space for it. They may be used in window plantings, in borders, porch boxes, window gardens, and period gardens where you wish to reproduce an old herb garden of some particular period or time, with its accessories. Pursuing this hobby brings about a keen sense of appreciation of these plants and their uses. If your interest in gardening has waned, there is nothing that will stimulate it more than selecting and planting some choice herbs, in the spring.

The subject matter on Herbs, includes some of the culinary herbs, wild simples, and herb gardens, accessories. Every herb garden should include, not only the culinary herbs, but some of the "simples for medicinal interest." A simple is a plant supposed to have one single or simple medicinal virtue, peculiar to it. Our forefathers relied upon these simples for the treatment of many ills, before the days of drug stores.

I am listing a number of these herbs:

Angelica (Angelica Archangelica); Sweet Anise (Pimpinella Anisum); Lemon Balm (Melissa Officinalis); Camomile, or Sweet Balm; Beth Root; Wild Bergamot (Monarda Didyma); Biren Bark; Borage (Borago Officinalis); Butterfly Bush (A medicinal plant); Burdock (a drug plant); Camomile (Anthemis Nobilis); Catnip (Nepeta Cataria); English Catnip; Country (Siphylum Offinatif); Sweet Calamus, or Sweet Flag; Cinnamon; Vine; C'mentis (a member of the 'rowfoot' family); Cleve Pink (Dilly-Flowers); Coriander (Coriandrum Sativum); Dill (Anethum graveolens); Elecampane (Inula officinalis); Sweet Fennel (Foeniculum Vulgare); Feverfew (Matricaria Canonilla); Garlic (Allium sativum); Rose Geranium (Pelargonium Graveolens); Lady Plymouth, Sweet Leaved Geranium (Pelargonium); Sweet Leaved Geranium; A Sweet Scented Geranium; Gingseng; Golden Seal (a very valuable drug plant); Ground Ivy, Gill-Over-The-Ground or Ale-Hoof (Glechoma hederacea); Horsemint (Mentha sylvestris); Horse Radish (Radicula arvensis); English Honeysuckle (Lonicera Caprifoliium); Horsehound (Galium vulgare); Lavender (Lavandula Spica) Sweet Marjoram (Origanum Marjorana); Medicinal Peppermint (Mentha Piperita); Spearmint (Mentha Spicata); Mugwort (Artemisia Vulgaris); Mullein (Verbascum Thapsus); Scarlet Monarda, Osvego Tea (Monarda didyma); Parsley (Petroselinum hortensis, Crispum); Periwinkle; Red Raspberry; Wild Raspberry; Rosemary (Rosmarinus Offinalis); Rose Leaf; Rue (Ruta Gravelolens) Sage (Salvia Offinalis); White Sage (Salvia Albiflora) Black Snake Root (Medicinal Herb); Summer Savory (Satureia Hortensis); Spikenard is a medicinal herb found in a few sections of Jackson County; Spice Wood; Thyme (Thymus Vulgaris); Tansy (Tanacetum Vulgare); Thoroughwort (Eupatorium Perfoliatum), commonly known as Boneset; Vermifuge or American Wormseed (Chenopodium Anthelminticum); Yarrow (Achillea Alpina).
