

WHITE PINE BLISTER RUST CONTROL

In a short time the Blister Rust project in Jackson County will resume its work in destroying currant and gooseberry bushes that are growing near white pine. In the spring and early summer seasons infected white pines transmit Blister Rust spores to gooseberry and currant bush leaves up to distance of 200 miles or more. The infected leaves in turn spread spores to other gooseberry or currant plants within a radius of about 3,000 feet during the summer months. The cycle is completed in the early fall when white pines within 1,000 feet of infected gooseberry or currant plants pick up spores through the needles. New infections on white pine then appear.

The only known method of check-mating against Blister Rust, cur-rently all currant and gooseberry bushes that are growing within 1,000 feet of white pine. If any blister is found on the leaves of currant or gooseberry bushes at this time of the year it should be reported to the agent in charge of the Jackson County Blister Rust project, H. A. Whitman, Jr. at Box 241, Sylva, or to the main office at 604 County Building in Asheville.

In order to protect our pines per-manently against Blister Rust cur-rant and gooseberry bushes must be permanently eradicated when found in the danger zone. The con-tinued cooperation of land owners is necessary especially at this season when the bushes become susceptible to Blister Rust.
