**NOISY SYLVA!**

**Parking In Sylva**

The problem of parking in Sylva has become a serious one. Not that there is not enough room for everybody to park, but that the available space for parking is largely taken up, throughout the whole city the whole day, and much of the night, by local people. This leaves little or no space for the traveling public, in case any of their number should desire to stop over here for a short time, to make a purchase, eat a meal, or spend the night.

People traveling by private automobile are not going to put in a long time looking for a place to park, just to get to stop in Sylva. If they can see no handy space, they will drive on to the next town. Thus the town that has no place for the public to park will lose much of the public's business.

It has resolved itself down to a question of cold cash. The town is that has resolved to provide a place for people to park is thereby extending a forceful invitation to the public to stop and spend money. Just now how much money Sylva has lost by reason of crowded parking space nobody can estimate, but it must amount to a tidy sum.

The best solution is for people of Sylva, who work in Sylva and drive to their work, to park their cars on the side streets such as Maple, Walnut, Spring, and Jackson. The walk from any of these to places of business is short and would cause little inconvenience. On the other hand, it would leave several blocks for the traveling public to park. If we should try it this summer, the volume of business done in local cafes, drug stores, groceries and other places of business would materially increase. This should be done by voluntary action of the people of this community. Barring such voluntary action, a thirty minute or one hour parking ordinance on Main Street would have the same effect.

People driving through town are worth nothing to us. They are only wearing out our streets and highways. It is the ones who stop and spend their money that are helping build our town.

If Sylva really appreciates the business of the country people and the tourists, we will leave the parking space for their use, when they come to town.

Having been a member of the General Assembly and an officer of the General Assembly, I have had opportunity to learn the work of the General Assembly. If the Democrats of Jackson county desire me to represent the county, I offer them my best services, as the Democratic candidate, and not the candidate of any group, faction, or individuals. Should any one of my opponents receive more votes in the primary than I do, I will be his enthusiastic and loyal supporter.
