The amount so far is \$211.66-not quite half of the country's quota.

N. C. Masons To Have Summer Meeting And **Outing At Waynesville**

The sixth annual Summer Assembly of the Grand Council, Royal and Select Masters, of North Carolina will be in Waynesville July 8, 9, and 10. Monday evening, July 8th, will be Blue Lodge Night, at which time the Master Mason's Degree will be conferred by the West Gate Olub of Haywood county. Following the degree work the meeting will be addressed by Charles H. Johnson, General Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of New York. Mr. Johnson is one of the outstanding Masonic speakers of the world, and all Masons of Western North Carolina as well as those visiting in this section, are invited to witness the degree work and hear Mr. Johnson. Many others, high in the ranks of Masonry, are to be present. A team from Cleveland, Ohio, is coming to confer the Super Excellent Master's Degree, on Tuesday evening July 9th. This team will consist of more than thirty men, and is said to be one of the finest in the country. All Select Masters are entitled to receive this degree without cost. On Tuesday morning, July 9, a trip will be made to the Masonic Marker and Monument. where a short ceremony will be observed. The party will then proceed to Heintooga Bald. views in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. The return will be by way of Soco Gap where the annual picnic lunch will be served. On Wednesday, July 9th, it has been planned to make a trip to Wayah Bald in Macon county, and return by way of Highlands and Cashiers. Wayah Bald is said by many to be the most attractive mountain view in Western North Carolina, and Highlands is the highest incorporated town in Eastern America. All Masons and their friends are invited to join in these mountain trips. The event will close with dance at the Waynesville Armory on Wednesday evening. There will be dancing for all, and a special feature will be an exhibition dance by the famous Soco Gap Square Dance Team that' danced at the White House, before the King and Queen of England.

The Nantahala Power and Light Company has consummated a contract with Morrison-Knudson Company for the construction of the Glenville dam across the Tuckaseigee River, below the mouth of Pine creek.

The dam at Gienville will have a dam 140 feet in height and will form a reservoir with a usable storage capacity of 68,000 acres. The dam will be earthfaced rock fills, with a cubic yardage of 458,000; and the cost of the project, including the driving of the tunnels, will run into several million dollars.

No intimation has been given as to just when the construction of the dam and driving the tunnels will begin, but it is expected to start in the immediate future. It is stated authoritatively by officials of the company that the construction of the Glenville dam, and the one in Macon county, across the Nantahala river, will tie in with the National Defense Program. The power created will be sold to local con-

sumers, and also will be used in the production of aluminum, a commodity vital to National defense. In plain language, this is taken to mean that most of the power, if it is used for the purpose stated, will be transmitted out of this immediate section, and put to industrial use elsewhere.

The Nantahala Power and Light Co. is a subsidary of the Aluminum Company of America, which is one of the great Mellon interests.

Legion Appoints Defense Committee

The National Defense Committee for Jackson County, appointed by the American Legion, is composed of Dan Tompkins, Sylva; T. Walter Ashe, Sylva; Edward Bryson, Speedwell; Thad Cowan, Green's Creek, and Blaine Nicholson, Cowarts. The duties of the committee are to assist the State Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation in keeping down subversive activities, and to act as liason officers between those agencies and the people. It is especially desired that subversive activities be suppressed, and at the same time innocent people be protected in their rights from persecution, or from injury by idle gossip. In other words, the Legion proposes that true Americanism be propagated and protected, that the civil rights of all the people be protected, in this time of stress, and when hysteria may strike in almost any locality, and at the same time, that the un-American elements and un-American activities be entirely suppressed. The people are invited to communicate to any member of this committee, any activities that is clearly understood that no communication will be given the slightest consideration unless the rule is made for the protection of the people and the Legion from anonymuos attack. However all communications sent to the strictest confidence. Nobody will jects. know anything about it except the-eommittee, and, if necessary the city, county, State or Fed-

eral authorities. The committee was appointed after the Legion convention in High Point, last week, accepted the task, at the request of Governor Hoey and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Another, and perhaps the most important task of the committee, and the Legion in general, is the propagation of true American and patriotic spirit among the people, to build up our morale, so that we may be able to meet any emergency farm subjects. that may arise out of the present world upheaval.

The dam will back water over many acres of the finest farming and trucking lands in Hamburg and Mountain townships. It will back up the river, Pine Creek, Hurricane Creek, Cedar Creek, and other tributaries of the Tuckaseigee; will necessitate removal of the Glenville High School buildings to a new location, or to higher ground; will cover the village of Glenville, and cause the removal of many Jackson county families from homes which they have owned and occupied for generations. The Glenville Baptist church and Masonic Lodge building will have to be removed, as will the cemetery that surrounds them.

In fact, it will constitute a complete change of the whole of Hamburg township, with the exception of Big Ridge, part of the Norton section, Yellow Mountain region, Shoal Creek, and more remote parts of the township. At the same time it will divert the flow of the Hamburg prong of the Tuckaseigee from the High Falls, from Onion Skin Falls, and the rapids between them.
