The above is a correct statistical report of the vote in Catawba county. It shows a slight gain in the number of votes cast for the Democrats and a gain over '84 for the Republicans, which shows the effects of Morton's boodle money. ### Election Returns.

Alexander stands firm against Linney, and elects the whole Democratic ticket.

Buncombe returns to the Democratic line and sends Democrats to the Legislature.

Burke goes Republican, except a member to the Legislature.

Caldwell elects a Republican Sheriff, but sends Newland, Democrat, to the Legislature. Blair, Democrat is 400 behind Pait for the Senate, and may be defeated in the district.

McDowell county has returned to the Democratic line and elected the whole Democratic ticket.

Rowan county gives 1600 Democratic majority, and probably takes our banner.

Mecklinburg rebukes Republican supervisors and Pinkerton detectives by a Democratic majority of 1200.

Durham goes Democratic by a majority of 200 with the help of Barkhead and his brother Prohibition, for which we extend our best wishes.

Cleveland has increased its majority to about 2000 and the banner will probably go there.

Wayne returns to the Democratic line and elects Democratic county officers and members to the Legislature.

We have elected our Governor and the whole State ticket by a handsome majority; including Supreme court Judges. We have elected eight congressmen. We have elected a Democratic legislature, which secures the return of Ransom to U. S. Senate.

### NEWS FROM THE DIFFERENT STATES.

#### IS ENCOURAGING AT FIRST, BUT DON'T LAST.

#### Hewitt Beats New York.

Bulletin dispatches from New York and elsewhere were received all night Tuesday night. They are not very satisfactory but we give a few of them.

#### Brooklyn, N. Y.

150 out of 375 Districts give Cleveland 33,283; Harrison 91,300; Fisk 1015.

#### New York City.

750 out of 856 Districts give Cleveland 139,750; Harrison 91,360; Fisk 1,015.

#### New York.

93 election Districts in New York State outside of N. Y., Kings county, Cleveland 14,929; Harrison 19,960; Fisk 1,023 same Districts in 1884 gave Cleveland 16,133; Blaine 19,642; St. John 931.

#### New York City.

The Sun Bulletin says, indications are 55,049 plurality for Cleveland in the city. State will go Republican by small plurality. Hill is probably elected.

#### New York.

Complete vote in New York is, Hill, 160,682; Muller, 96,199.

#### Chicago, Ill.

82 Precincts in the city give Harrison 14,406; Cleveland, 16,178.

The New York bulletin says: Rhode Island goes Republican by 4,000 plurality. New York goes Democratic.

#### Louisville, Ky.

Carlisle has a larger majority than ever before.

New York.—222 districts in New York, outside of the City and Kings county give Hill 36,584; Miller, 49,949; Jones, 2,730. Same in 1884 gave Hill 29,985; Davenport, 39,815; Bascomb, 3,598.

#### New York.

One of the first bits of crooked work at the polls was discovered by the Business Men's Cleveland and Thurman watchers at 82, Greenwield-street, where Harrison electoral tickets were being peddled from County Democracy booths.

This is the First Assembly District and is the Sixth Congressional District, where Quay advised Republicans to vote for the County Democracy candidate for Congress ex-Alderman John Cavanagh.

This is also the home of Col. Mike Murphy, that "good fellow" who has received the endorsement of Abraham S. Hewitt as a candidate for Sheriff.

Thus Hewitt's treachery loses us New York and all know the result of such sale. Still there is a chance.

The New York Commercial Advance says: late returns indicate the election of Harrison and Morton Hill is elected Governor by about 10,000 plurality.

Indiana probably Republican by small majority. Republicans will have a good working majority in next Congress. It places Harrison's plurality in that State at 8,172.

Two-thirds of the State of Virginia give Democratic losses of 2,500. Democrats expect gains in portions

of the State not heard from and claim the State by 3,500 to 4,500 majority.

287 precincts in North Carolina show a Cleveland gain of 700.

12:55 P. M. — Returns from one fourth of the precincts in North Carolina show a Cleveland gain of 913. The Democrats are increasing their vote in the east. Legislature certainly Democratic.

#### Raleigh, N. C.

North Carolina Democrats by 20,000 or 25,000. New York uncertain but claimed for Cleveland by 1000.

Cleveland has been sold out all over New York and things look dark. Up till today, as we go to press at 12 o'clock M., we can't get anything definite, but still there is a hope, and we are holding to it. We may get New York, and we may win without New York.
