### A GOOD SIGN.

As all eyes are now bent on New York, where the battle for the presidency is to be decided. The news that the registration for the election in the city and in Brooklyn this year is the largest ever known will be hailed as a bright harbinger of democratic success.

The registration in New York city for Monday and Wednesday compared with previous years was as follows:

In 1888, 187,491; in 1890, 140,208; in 1891, 150,168; in 1892, 200,876. The latter is the highest ever known.

### THIRD PARTY UNMASKED.

The political conspiracy between the radicals and third partyites in North Carolina is but a repetition of the efforts of these people in Arkansas, Florida and Georgia to defeat democracy, representing the will of the majority, and installing in power the radical party. To accomplish this wicked and ruinous object, in the states named, a coalition was formed by the aforesaid parties, aided and strengthened by a lavish use of money, furnished by the republican national committee, but to no purpose. At the elections in said states, democracy triumphed by increased majorities, and just so, do we think, it will be with us at the approaching election. Yea, we know the idiocy of third partyism, allied with venal and revolutionary republicanism, cannot defeat the sturdy virtues and inflexible principles of true democracy. Then, we shall triumph! The state government will continue in the hands of democrats, and the nation will be redeemed from the misrule and oppressions of radicalism. The vain and illusory promises, by which thousands of good men have been seduced from their fidelity to the democratic party, have been exploded, and the unprincipled demagogues who have deceived the people and taken advantage of the public distress to advance their individual fortunes, are now conscious that their plans have miscarried, and that henceforth the curses and maledictions of the men, whom their perfidy has outraged, will dog their footsteps to the grave. A sad, sad picture; but, yet, the immutable law of retribution is just! Emanating from God and crystalizing itself into the history of all the civilizations of the earth, it is madness to question its equity or attempt to escape its visitation. Humanity will pardon errors of judgment, and throw the mantle of charity over intemperate zeal; but pure unadulterated viciousness, that would prostitute personal character and the public weal to the advancement of unholy ambitions must pay the penalty for its crimes. The leaders of the third party could not have sinned innocently, for they have trampled upon the most elementary principles of moral ethics, and have committed acts universally disapproved. They entered the democratic conventions, assisted in writing the platforms and nominating the candidates, and then, without the semblance of justification, repudiate the work of their own hands and nominate a third party ticket, and as soon as satisfied of the impossibility of success, they enter into a conspiracy with the republicans,

their natural and implacable enemies, for the destruction of the democratic party, and the surrender of the commonwealth to the perfidious keeping of radicalism. A few months back, the thirds were loud in their professions of loyalty to the democratic party, actually claiming that only in the third party could Jeffersonian democracy be found, but now they openly avow their determination to overthrow these principles, and establish upon a solid basis Harrisonism. Having ridiculed democratic fears about the force bill, as a mere vagary of the imagination, precipitated into the campaign by demagogues, to frighten the unsophisticated and solidify the party, they are now advocating the measure as the *sine qua non* to honest elections. They boldly proclaim today, what they denied or suppressed yesterday, and such doubtless will be the policy of third partyism to the end, it being conceived in deception and brought forth in treachery, we can quite accurately see the disasters which would have resulted to the best interests of society and the well being of the government itself, had this party succeeded in grasping political power. Lust for office and the disreputable records of its leaders, are the distinguishing characteristics of North Carolina third partyism.

### ACCURATE VIEW OF THE SITUATION.
