

WAIL OF THE WILTED.

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The World's Estimate.

New York, November 11.—The World this morning says Benjamin Harrison and Whitelaw Reid are worse beaten in the electoral college than any men who have run for president since Horace Greeley's campaign.

They will receive barely more votes than Greeley would have had, had he lived until the college met. Cleveland will have many more votes in the electoral college than any other candidate has ever before had.

The transfer of Ohio into the democratic column, raising Cleveland's vote to over 300 and reducing Harrison to little more than one hundred. The latest reports indicate that the next United States senate will be divided as follows:

- Democrats, 12. Republicans, 40. People's party, 6.

Late returns from Kansas are not so encouraging for the fanatics as they were at first, but it has apparently voted for Weaver electors.

A claim is made to Nebraska by the republicans on the strength of republican gains in the first district, but the state is usually given to Weaver electors.

The returns are such, however, as to inspire the republicans to cheer the state.

Indiana gives Cleveland a majority from 6,000 to 12,000. They state that we still in doubt are North Dakota, which is probably republican and South Dakota which is probably carried by the fanatics.

The Emperor, who has already cabled you, has been constantly consulting Count Walderssee, now thoroughly appreciates the gravity of the situation, and it is believed that at any moment the return to power of Prince Bismarck or of Count Walderssee—perhaps of both is quite possible, and such a step would be hailed with enthusiasm throughout the Empire.

Good Bye to Watson.

There is no lack of causes for rejoicing on the part of the people of Georgia today, but among all the triumphs of yesterday's great contest, none will be dearer to their hearts than that won in the tenth congressional district of this state.

The defeat of Thomas E. Watson by J. C. C. Black is the defeat of the people's party in Georgia. The party concentrated all its strength in that district. Mr. Watson has been looked upon as the head and front of the entire people's party movement, not only in Georgia but in the south. He had a strong personal following in the district acquired while he was a democrat, and he had the assistance of the negroes and republicans in his race. In the face of these facts his defeat of Watson is a splendid and significant victory, only less momentous to Georgia than the election of the great tariff reformer to the presidency.

The whole state has watched the struggle in the tenth district with intense and vivid interest, realizing its importance to the future of the democratic party. The result will be the signal for a sigh of relief and an outburst of spontaneous rejoicing, that the only serious outbreak of third partyism in this state has been nipped in the bud.

Major Black will represent the tenth as it deserves to be represented, and the democrats of the district will not have their trust betrayed as it was betrayed by the man who, hands that, pined it two years ago. Mr. Watson has been retired to the shades of private life and given an opportunity for reflection which it is to be hoped will cure him of the mania which seems to have seized upon him of late.—[Athens Journal.]

McPherson for Secretary of Treasury.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Nov. 11.—It was announced here to day by a local democrat who is in touch with Chairman Harity and other leading members of the party, that Senator John R. McPherson, of New Jersey, will be the secretary of the treasury in Cleveland's cabinet. The senator's relations with Mr. Cleveland have always been close, personally and politically, it was said and long before the Chicago convention, when New Jersey's democratic attitude was a matter of concern, he succeeded in bringing Governor Abbott and other influential democrats into line for Cleveland. Senator McPherson is further given credit for New Jersey's sturdy support of the president elect at the Chicago convention, and also for keeping the state in the democratic line last Tuesday.

WHEELING, W. Va., Nov. 11.—Returns from about three-fourths of the state show that the democratic plurality on the national and state tickets will be between 2,000 and 4,000. All four of the democratic candidates for congress are elected by pluralities of 200 to 1,000. Senator Faulkner will succeed himself.
