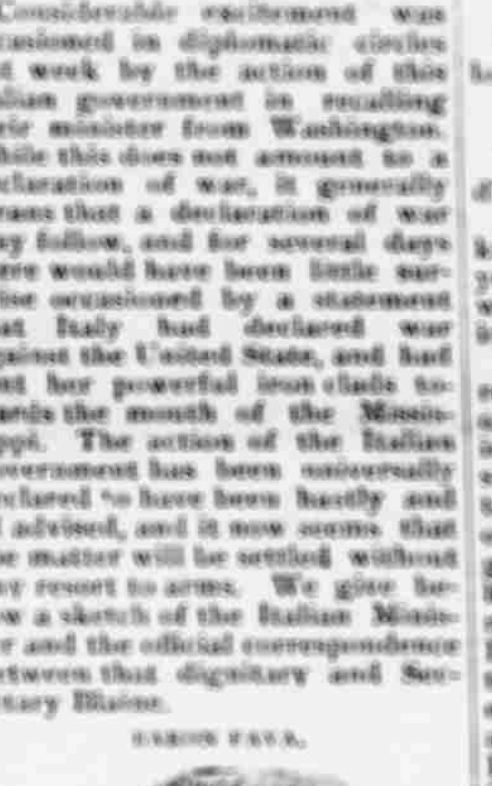

The following is the official correspondence between Secretary Blaine and Baron Fava made public by the Department of State.

ROYAL LEGATION OF ITALY, WASHINGTON, March 25, 1891. MR. SECRETARY OF STATE:

By my two notes of the 15th and 18th instant, I had the honor to call Your Excellency's serious attention to the circumstances of exceptional gravity which took place at New Orleans on the 14th, whereby four subjects of the King of Italy, who were confined in the prison of that city, were massacred by the crowd under the leadership of two American citizens.
