Motz were returning in a buggy from the Lithbia Springs this afternoon at about 11 o'clock and when they were about half a mile from town they were fired upon. S. Motz was struck by seven buckarm and the other three in his right side, probably entering his heart. Michael returned the fire and severely wounded Charlie Motz. Of the assaulting parties, Charlie Motz is spitting blood, and the extent of his injuries is not known. Michael was shot in the arm and leg, but is not thought to be dangerously wounded, Chas. Motz, John Motz and Caldwell Motz, three brothers, and first cousins of S. C. Motz, remained by the corpse and were taken into custody. S. C. 
