A WINTRY SEASON.

LAST WEEK'S SNOW STORM SPREADS FROM MAINE TO NORTH CAROLINA.

Railway Trains Stalled in Snow Drifts. Loss of Life from the Severe Cold. The Coldest Weather in years is Reported from All Over the Country. Telegrams Taken from the Daily Papers of Last Week.

COLD ALL OVER NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, Jan. 11.—Flushing Bay is frozen over out to the East River for the first time in many years. The New York and College Point ferry-boat was frozen fast at its dock last night and was unable to move out this morning.

BLOCKADE IN OHIO.

YOUNGSTOWN, Jan. 11.—The first train from Painesville on the Painesville and Fairport Railroad since last Saturday night reached here to-night, traffic having been stopped all along the line by immense snow blockades.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 11.

According to telegraphic advices received at the weather bureau, the present storm started in northern Montana Tuesday, came southwestward over the middle Mississippi valley, where there was but little fall. It centered last night in West Virginia and gradually took southerly and northerly courses, spreading over North Carolina, Maryland, District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, New York and all of New England.

PHILADELPHIA FROZEN UP.

The extreme cold weather is having serious effect in the vicinity of Hazleton, Pa. Work on coal strippings was suspended today. Numerous cases of frost bite have been reported with the loss of fingers and ears. At Philadelphia, as far as they can see up and down the river, the river is packed with ice.

ST. MARKS, O., Jan. 12.—

With the thermometer hanging zero, and the natural gas pressure down to nothing, there came the starting report from the main which had been from intense cold yesterday afternoon, and that of the supply altogether, thus leaving the inhabitants of this city at the mercy of the frigid weather.

TRAINS STALLED IN THE SNOW.

TOLDO, O., Jan. 12.—Trains on twenty roads entering Toledo are delayed from there to fifteen hours by snow. The Toledo, Ann Arbor and North Michigan train has been fast in a snow bank north of Corunna, for twelve hours.
