Fletcher Says Veterans, Both Wars, Get Aid

Raleigh, March 21.—Veterans of this war, temporarily unemployed, received \$243,831.00 in readjustment allowances under the G. I. Bill of Rights during the first six-month period of operations...

The number of individual veterans receiving allowances while waiting to find employment, Fletcher stated, increased each month through January when an average of 791 veterans were paid each week. Last month, the average number of veterans receiving the weekly payments dropped to 398.

last in the six-month period, reflected a general decrease in veterans claims, Fletcher continued. A total of 410 initial claims and 3061 continued claims were processed during last month, whereas in January veterans filed 510 initial claims and 3827 continued claims.

Chairman Fletcher estimates that altogether about 325,000 North Carolina service men and women will be eligible for these allowances, since veterans who have served 90 days or more in the armed forces and received honorable discharges are entitled to receive them...

It is apparent, according to Col. Fletcher, that relatively few of the veterans who have returned to the state to date—which he estimates at around 20,000—have made applications for readjustment allowances.
