Raleigh, May 8 .- A recording volt meter test of the supply of electricity in Wallace shows that the "distribution of electric current is not keeping pace with the demand." accerding to C. D. Baucom, superintendent of the Weights and Measures division of the State Department of Agriculture.

Baucom, who supervised the test. charged that the Tidewater Light and Power Company is failing to provide electricity to its Wallace clients in compliance with the terms of the franchise, which he said stipulates that the voltage should not vary more than six volts.
