Farm News Few Changes In Point Values Occur In July

Raleigh, July 4.—Very few point changes are announced by OPA for the month of July, with processed foods, beef, lamb and veal all remaining stable, according to the district office in Raleigh. Pork remains practically unchanged, the only changes being minor increases for certain fat cuts.

Margarine, because of its shorter supply, is upped two points, making it 14 points per pound; butter remains unchanged at 24 points per pound for creamery butter 12 points for country or process butter.

The points for canned fish are higher in July because of reduced supply for civilians. Canned tuna and salmon are now 9 points per pound; oysters, 4 points.

Cheeses take a decided drop, according to the new point chart, with 2 to 4 point decreases in all classes of rationed cheese.

Lard, shortening, and salad and cooking oils retain the 12-point value which went into effect June 17th, OPA said.

Clearing Up The Streams

Selective Service must be applied to farming in Person county to most effectively use the crop producing powers of our soils according to J. W. Wilburn, agriculture teacher.

"We have heard much about Selective Service for the Armed Forces, said Mr. Wilburn, in which men and women because of their health, physical condition and capabilities were selected to train and fight for our country. Then too, we are also aware of the fact that certain industrial and manufacturing plants because of their physical type of machinery and capabilities were selected to produce certain wartime materials in supplying the war demands. We also know that to be selected for training and to fight overseas or to produce or manufacture wartime materials for overseas use is an honor and a privilege as a citizen to be of service to his country."

This conservation minded citizen further pointed out that many of us will venture in saying that Person county farm boys and other agricultural minded service men and women together with some who are now returning to farms realize that here on the homefront we can do much good if we will practice Selective Service in farming. Selective Service as applied to farming means Selective Acres.

Mr. H. K. Sanders in last Thursday's article stated: "A Farm Plan provides for conservation farming and this new 'farm tool' . . . using the land according to its capabilities and treating it according to its needs includes applications of soil and water conservation practices needed on tobacco farms in Person county."

We cannot over emphasize selecting each acre for use according to its capabilities and treating it accordingly to its needs. Select the best tobacco acres for your tobacco allotment, keeping in mind the slope, erosion and soil type. Select the natural draws and depressions for meadow water disposal areas and for hay crops. Plant kudzu on those idle gully areas and old road banks. Select the steep areas near the barn and streams for pasture areas. Select the unproductive borders along the edge of woods for wildlife development. In cutting fuel wood for use on the farm practice selective cutting of trees on wooded areas needing improvement. Then too, select with care those acres needing terracing, making sure you have proper outlets. At the same time select those acres unsuitable for terracing because of steepness of slope.
