Highway Speed To

Raleigh-Maj. H. J. (Doggie) Hatcher, commander of the North Carolina State Highway Patrol, will recommend to Governor Cherry and the Council of State that the present 35-mile per hour speed limit in the State be increased by only 10 miles an hour.

The major said yesterday he considered the pre-war limit of 60 miles per hour too high "even in normal times." In the immediate postwar period, such a limit "certainly would produce tragic results," he added, "considering the condition of a majority of the au-

tomobiles now being driven."
The Condition of State probably will act on lifting the wartime speed limit before the Fall holiday period. The 35-mile per hour figure was set by the Governor under emergency powers given by the Legislature.

Hatcher also said that he expects about 80 highway patrolmen now in the armed forces to return to their jobs. The patrol, with a normal complement of 213, was reduced during the war to a present force of


