Friends and relatives of the couple are invited to attend.

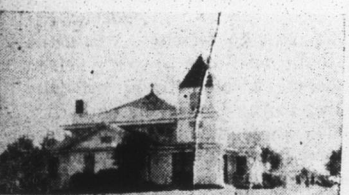
