## Proper Direction Of Welfare In State Important

The proper direction of North Carolina's social welfare program with the object of conserving the State's human resources is a grave responsibility shared by both the counties and the State government, Governor R. Gregg Cherry told the North Carolina Association of County Superintendents of Public Welfare at their annual dinner meeting at the Hotel Carolina.

The Governor was presented by Dr. Ellen Winston, Commissioner of Public Welfare. Mrs. John Lee Wilson, Rockingham County welfare head and association president, presided at the dinner.

"Just as we have set about the conservation of our soil, forests, minerals, game and fish to make certain that our natural resources are not depleted in the future, so must we conserve our people. The natural resources are worthless unless the people of the State can obtain their fullest use and enjoyment," the Governor said.

conventional reciprocating engine and jet. This plan was described as particularly effective for dive bombers, torpedo bombers and long range patrol land planes.

A complete new field of propulsion is being investigated in the realm of guided missiles, the Navy said. Power planes to give speeds of more than 700 miles per hour—above the speed sound—are under way.

An extensive pilotless aircraft program was already under way on V-J Day, with successful development of such devices as "globe," "gorgon," and "garboyle."

"Man's mind will be too slow for combat of the future," the Navy said today, "but man's mind can devise the defense."

Fromising the vigorous pursuit of peacetime research in naval aviation a Navy release predicted: "The pilotless aircraft of the future controlled by electronics, will 'home' electronically on its target. Electronic 'brains' will guide the counter-missile with precision. Out of research and development programs will come airborne radars which can initiate defense."

Plans call for experimentation in new types of piloted aircraft, related aircraft of all types, methods of propulsion, fuels and aerodynamic principles.

With improvements inturbo-jet engines now in sight, and with high speed a prime characteristic of a fighter airplane, future Navy fighters will probably be jet-powered, possibly with rocket assistance for short bursts of extremely high speed, the Navy said.

## Inventors Plan For Housewives

Richmond, Va.—America's inventors seem to be turning their talents away from warlike ideas and devoting their energies to the improvement of gadgets for Mrs. Housewife. For among the 482 patents granted this week by the United States Patent Office were four for refrigerators, one for a washing machine, another for a domestic laundry unit, and others for jar lid openers, clothes hangers and other household utensils.

One of the 56 designs patented during the week was for a fancy-twisted clothespin.

Madame Housewife's complexion wasn't forgotten, either, for 13 of

## the 128 trademarks, published were for various beauty preparations. One of them, manufactured by the Granville Laboratories of Chicago, Ill., is labeled "Swoon."

The floor unit for refrigerators patented by Charles H. Walker of Oklahoma City, Okla., is for the old-type ice refrigerator, and provides a drainage system which takes little from the food compartment. The shallow, hollow floor unit filters the water draining from the ice compartment. The patent is unassigned.

Floyd L. Robinson of Fort Smith, Ark., has patented a cooling unit for an open air refrigerator. Wall plates are arranged in pairs to receive the tubes through which the cooling fluid flows, making it possible to use a light-weight metal for the tubes. His patent is unassigned.

The condensing unit of the refrigeration apparatus patented by E. C. Tanner of Springfield, Mass., is in the lower compartment of the refrigerator. The evaporator, fan, condensing unit and removable wall portion are removable from the cabinet as a single unit. The patent is assigned to Westinghouse Electric Corporation of East Pittsburgh, Pa.


