Many Volunteer To Head Clothing Collections

New York.—More than 2900 men and women thus far have agreed to serve as local chairmen in their communities for the Victory Clothing Collection for overseas relief scheduled for January 7-31. Henry J. Kaiser, national chairman for the drive, announced tonight.

Wisconsin leads the states with 237 acceptances, topping New York's 178. Texas is third with 163, Pennsylvania has 132, Illinois, 131, and Nebraska, 127 chairmen.

The majority of these men and

women organized their communities last spring in the collection of serviceable used clothing which furnished sorely needed garments to 25,000,000 war-victims of Europe, China and the Philippine Islands.

The goal of the January drive is 100,000,000 garments, in addition to shoes and bedding, for the needy and destitute in war-devastated lands. The collection is conducted on behalf of UNRRA.

Evicted Couple Has Respite

Milwaukee, Nov.—Evicted from a two-room lean-to they called a home, sleeping in street cars, on benches in trolley stations and in cocktail lounges for two months, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Schultz, both 48, finally got a break this Thanksgiving Day when they developed acute bronchitis.

For the first night since Sept. 6 they slept in clean clothes and in a warm bed—at the Milwaukee County Emergency Hospital. The World War I veteran and

his wife were evicted last September from two squalid rooms erected against a garage and moved into the streets with only the clothes they wore. The first night they sat in a park, the second night they slept at the bowling alleys where Schultz was employed, then moved into the street cars.

"We would get on the street cars or buses and ride back and forth, back and forth," Schultz said. "When we got tired we would go into the trolley station at the end of the line and sit there the rest

of the night." When Schultz went to work at the bowling alleys in the morning his wife would sleep on a bench in the cocktail lounge. Schultz finally was unable to continue pin setting and he and his wife were sent to the hospital with bronchitis, brought on by exhaustion and exposure. Attendants at the county general hospital said Thursday that Schultz was a patient there, but that Mrs. Schultz had recovered.
