Jap Criminals Of War Under Arrest

Tokyo.—In the most important single list of war crime suspects yet issued by allied headquarters, General MacArthur has ordered the arrest of 59 prominent Japanese reaching for the first time into the imperial household and the ranks of Japan's industrial-financial hierarchy, the Zaibatsu. MacArthur's abolition of the national financial control association and completion of a detailed inventory of Japanese industry, to form the basis of whatever reparations Japan may be required to pay, were other steps in the direction of demilitarizing Japan.

Those ordered arrested included 71-year-old Prince Morimasa Nashimoto and two former premiers, Baron Kichiro Hiranuma and Koki Hirota. Two other ex-premiers, Kuniaki Koiso and Hideki Tojo, already are behind bars.

Political leaders, several generals and admirals, two newspaper executives and a number of important industrialists and bankers who financed Japan's aggression were among the persons whose arrest by the Japanese government was ordered by the supreme allied command.

did not specify any charges against Nashimoto, a lesser prince who became a field marshal in 1932 and who was a supreme war councilor for many years.

The new list, appearing as thalies prepared to prosecute the first of 259 suspects in custody, seemed to answer the question raised here since family control of Japanese industry and finance was ordered broken up: Would members of the zaibatsu themselves face trial?

Ordered arrested were such financial giants as Kiyoshi Goko, former president of the Mitsubishi heavy industries company; Seihei Ikeda, a Mitsui banker who became governor of the Bank of Japan; and Chikunei Nakajima, founder of a fighter aircraft production company.

Upon the issuance of a decree of divorce from the bonds of matrimony, all rights arising out of the marriage cease and either party may marry again unless otherwise barred by law. Thus, although a judgment for alimony obtained prior to divorce is not affected thereby, a wife could not maintain a separate action for support after the granting of the divorce.

Increases Income Through Corn

Thad Carlton is a good example of North Carolina farmers, who are finding that corn production is highly profitable when large yields are obtained through the use of hybrid seed and extra fertilization, particularly nitrogen.

This Yadkin County farmer reduced the cost of corn production from 87 cents a bushel to 57 cents, while at the same time, he increased his net profits by more than four times, not counting land rent as an item of expense.

With 500 pounds of 3-12-6 fertilizer, his local variety of corn, and about 4,000 plants per acre, he produced 40 bushels of corn per acre at an expense of \$35. With 500

pounds of 3-12-6, 10,000 plants of of soda, he made 115 bushels of corn Tenn-10, and 850 pounds of nitrate per acre at an expense of \$68.
