Raleigh, Jan.—Recent announcements that sugar ration books will henceforth be issued for all of North Carolina by the OPA district office in Raleigh does not mean that present holders of books will get a new one. Theodore S. Johnson, Director of the Office of Price Administration said today. Johnson said the announcements simply indicated that returning service people, who have never had ration books, or families having new babies, may apply for sugar ration books by obtaining an application blank at the local board and sending it to the Raleigh Office properly filled out. Davlin of the office of reconstruction, Washington, are among headliners who have accepted invitations to address the annual sessions of the mid-winter North Carolina Newspaper Institute to be held at
