Kaiser May Build Houses Next Venture

Henry J. Kaiser, the wartime shipbuilder and postwar automobile producer, is considering a plan to turn his mass production genius to the prefabricated housing industry, it was reported in Washington, and there is talk of his turning out 1,000,000 ready-made homes a year, opening a booming new market for southern lumber.

Wilson Wyatt, the new housing czar appointed by President Truman to expedite the critically needed home building program, has conferred with Kaiser in Detroit.

Before Wyatt entered the scene, the civilian production administration had estimated the rate of

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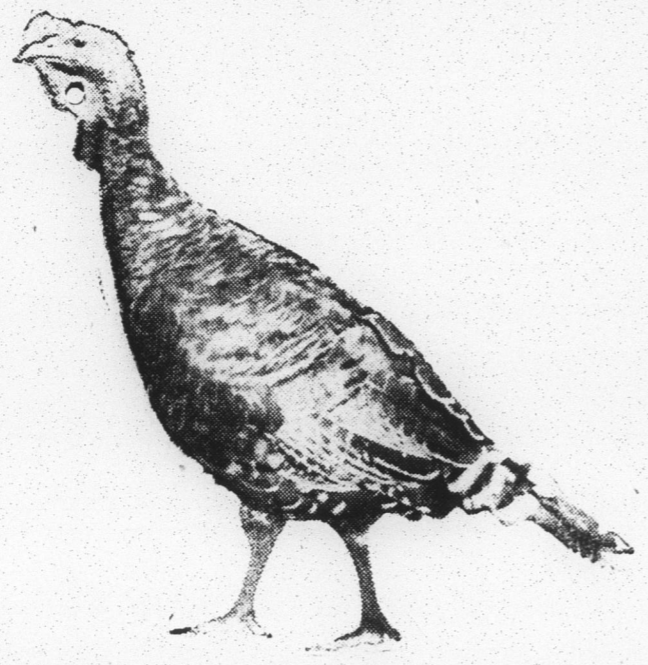
