Prices On Milk Are Increased

OPA has announced that, effective June 7, established prices on approved fluid milk and specified fluid milk products have been increased as follows:

1. 40 cents per cwt. or 4 cents per gallon or 10 1/2 cents per pound butterfat, to producers.
2. 1 cent per quart, 1/2 cent per pint, and 1/4 cent per 1/2 pint at wholesale and retail levels for approved fluid whole milk.
3. 1/2 cent per quart and proportionate amounts for other sizes, on buttermilk, chocolate milk, chocolate milk drinks, and other flavored milk drinks at wholesale and retail levels.
4. 1 cent per 1/2 pint on fluid cream containing at least 16 per cent butterfat, and proportionate amounts for other sizes, at wholesale and retail levels.

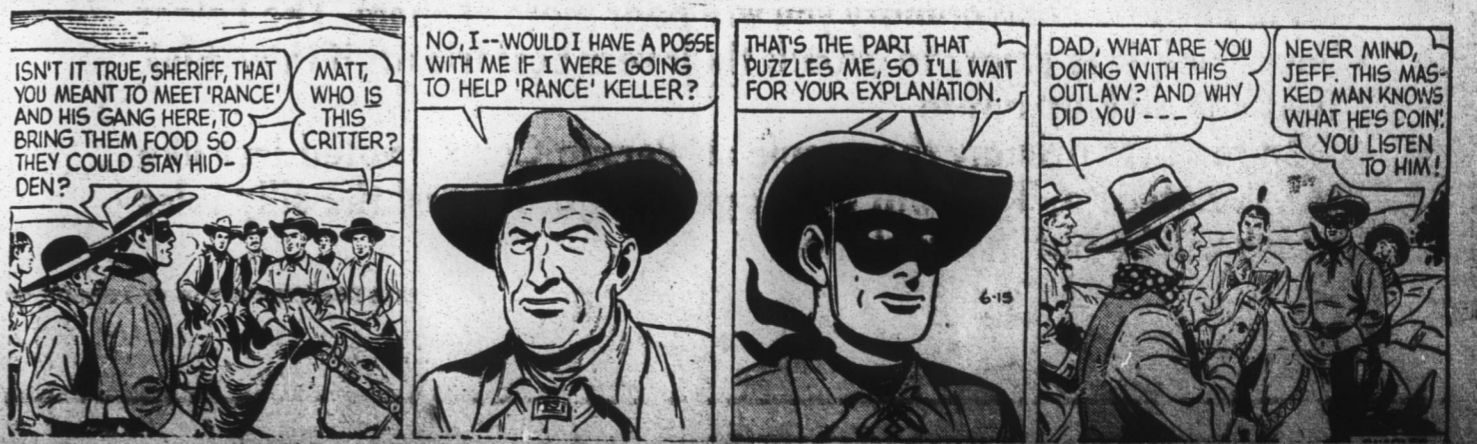
