we had just heard the warnings for neighboring counties. Then, a few minutes later, a big gust hit, the house shook a little and we heard a faint thump.

At this point we decided to relocate to the bathroom. where Tyson looked out of the window and said she saw the large oak tree in our backyard falling. At the time I thought she was referring to the large chunks of limbs blowing off the trees, because that's all I could see from where I was standing, but even that was enough to convince me this was no ordinary storm. We ducked down and moved closer to the middle of the house as the storm quickly passed. I still wasn't thinking "tornado" until Tyson said, "I think that was a tornado."
