



Vitamin D & Diabetes

People at high risk for type 2 diabetes may benefit from taking vitamin D. In a new study, participants with pre-diabetes were assigned to take either vitamin D, calcium, both or a placebo for four months. Researchers then measured how well their pancreatic beta-cells produced insulin. The vitamin D group had a 15 to 30% improvement in beta-cell function. Previous studies have also shown that vitamin D reduces insulin resistance, an early symptom of type 2 diabetes. If you have a higher than normal blood sugar, ask your doctor or pharmacist about vitamin D and how much is right for you.
