The Trojan running game left with him, gaining just 87 yards on 25 carries without the sophomore tailback. The Tar Heels capitalized on the turnover 3:38 later when Leon Johnson (10 carries, 94 yards) scampered 19 yards into the end zone, capping a nine-play drive for the game's first score. "I think the loss of Dwight McFadden for the season with a broken leg was a tough blow for us," Robinson said. "We really didn't recover after that."

USC's Cole Ford kicked a 27-yard field goal with seven minutes into the second quarter, but the Trojans failed to capitalize good field position after a Leon Johnson fumble on UNC's next drive. Stanicek threw deep on the next play to a streaking Bucky Brooks for a 47-yard completion to the Trojan 20. At third and goal from the three, three Trojans wrapped up Stanicek on the option, but the junior quarterback slipped to Curtis Johnson (17 carries, 82 yards), who walked into the end zone for the score. After Tripp Pignetti's point, the Tar Heels led 14-3.

USC received the second-half kickoff, but on the second play of the half, Scott Fields, McFadden's replacement at tailback, caught up the ball at the UNC 21. Linebacker Ray Jacobs made the hit and the fumble recovery. Two-and-a-half minutes later, kick returner turned running back Marcus Wall duped two Trojan defenders on the option to sweep into the end zone. With 11:43 left in the third, UNC led 21-3. The Tar Heels added a field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter and a touchdown with 7:47 left in the game. A 67-yard drive on eight running plays capped by

fullback William Henderson's eight-yard run put the Tar Heels ahead 31-3. The Trojans scored their first and only touchdown with two minutes left in the game. The contest had a bowl-game atmosphere. For the pre-game show, about three dozen Elvis impersonators danced onto the field (and five sky-dived into the end zone) as the USC band spelled out "Elvis." The halftime show featured all sorts of strange Disney animals galloping around Toot Town. A small, but loud, Carolina cheering section included some former UNC stars. James "Boom-Boom" Betterson, a former

1,000-yard rusher at Carolina, NBA star James Worthy and Deems May, a tight end who is trying to make the Chargers, came to the game. And although it counts as just another season win, the Tar Heels left Anaheim's stadium feeling pretty good about their performance. It's the first time a Mack Brown team has defeated a "traditional powerhouse," so to speak. USC is one of college football's most successful programs.
