five 3-pointers. It's only the second time this season that she's hit more than four of her trademark shots.

Lawrence said her teammates have contributed to her recent improvement.

"My teammates are finding me in open situations, whether it be in transition or through the plays we've been running," she said. "My teammates are definitely finding me when I'm open and when I have a chance to shoot the ball. That contributes to my attempts and making more shots."

Despite a sporadic season, Lawrence is North Carolina's all-time leader in 3-point field goals made, with a new mark of 201,

besting the 194 made by Tonya Sampson (1991-94).

At the other end of the experience ladder, Reid made her presence felt on the court. A top freshman reserve, she has started in 11 games and was the team's leading scorer in six of those contests.

Reid's recent performances may re-earn her a spot in the starting lineup.

"Tracy might get back in the lineup," Hatchell said. "She's got to take care of a lot of little details, on and off the court."

Reid was tight-lipped about what would get her back in starting position.

"Effort," was her only comment.

Reid is a four-time ACC Rookie of the Week (in the earlier part of the season) and is the team's third-leading scorer and second-leading rebounder, behind Smith.

Women Fencers Fall to Fighting Irish

The North Carolina women's fencing team lost only its second match all year Friday in Durham, but it crushed three other opponents.

The men's team went 1-3 Saturday at the Duke Dual Meets at Card Gymnasium.

The tournament featured such teams as Stanford, James Madison, Notre Dame, William & Mary and Duke, along with the Tar Heels.

The women fencers came into the matches with an impressive 22-1 record. Eyeing a No. 1 ranking going into the NCAA Regionals, they finished their part of the competition Friday with a 3-1 mark.

Their lone loss was a 20-12 setback to Notre Dame. UNC completed the day's events in dominating fashion, whipping Duke, Stanford, and James Madison by a combined 71-25.

"The loss to Notre Dame was very disappointing," coach Ron Miller said. "It was much closer than the score indicates."

So close, in fact, that had five touches gone North Carolina's way, it would have beaten the Irish, Miller said.

Going into the regionals, which begin in two weeks in Chapel Hill, the women fencers are in the top four and could conceivably be No. 1 when the competition ensues.

The men moved to 12-12 on the season. One of the team's three losses was 14-13 to Duke, the first loss in its history to the

Devils. Their other two losses came to Notre Dame and Stanford, both by 17-10 counts.

The Tar Heels managed to win against William & Mary, beating the Tribe 14-13.

Miller was not discouraged by the men's results, however, saying that the day was filled with unlikely finishes.

"It was a strange day, if you look at the results," Miller said. "It was strange considering the comparative scores."

Both the men and women will compete in the National Junior Olympics in San Jose, Calif., next weekend.

"We should qualify six people next week," he said. "I'm very optimistic (about the regionals). Our women have a great chance in all weapons, and our men have a great chance in the saber."

of things, but we need to put it all together," Hatchell said. "Like with our defense — we're playing some great defense sometimes, but then we're not blocking out. And on offense, we're getting it out, we're getting our fast break going, and we're not getting a lot of good shots underneath the basket, but we're not finishing it with the made basket."

UNC led from the opening tip, but GMU sophomore forward Gretchen Lacey's long jumper cut that lead to 21-16 with 7:25 left in the half. The Tar Heels led 41-25 at the break. Lacey's 12 points were second to Tracy Kirk's 13 for the Patriots.

Charlotte Smith and Stephanie Lawrence led North Carolina with 17 points each, and Smith grabbed 11 boards for her fifth consecutive double-double and her 14th on the season.

Lawrence hit 5-of-10 3-pointers, her second-best showing of the year. She went 6

for 9 on treys Jan. 28 against Wake Forest. Lawrence broke the school career 3-pointer record Wednesday at Georgia Tech. Tonya Sampson previously held the record with 194 treys. Lawrence has now hit 201.

The win was the 100th for the Tar Heel seniors: Lawrence, Smith, Gwendolyn Gillingham, Carrie McKee and Jill Suddreth. Gillingham's six points contributed to UNC's total of 31 by reserves. Tracy Reid led the bench with 13 points

and seven boards in 27 minutes.

A late-season, nonconference game could help prepare the Tar Heels for the approaching ACC and NCAA tournaments. Smith said this game could help UNC find and fix errors.

"I'm glad we have a game outside of the ACC," she said. "They're a good team, and it gives us the chance to experiment. We made a lot of mistakes that we can learn from."
