The Tar Heels opened up strong, as UNC won the doubles point when David Caldwell and Morrow defeated Frank Salazar and Sprengelmeyer 8-6 at No. 1 doubles, and David Britt and Robert Tedesco matched that score by beating Cris Robinson and Burne Elemming at No. 3



But UNC claimed only two singles matches, as Caldwell ousted Chris Angell 6-4, 6-2, and Britt pasted Bryan Twente 6-3, 6-0. Paul Harsanyi, Tedesco and Tony Thomas all fell in two sets. Although the team will not advance, Caldwell and Morrow will. UNC's top two seeds will both compete in the NCAA singles charmionshins, which becan Wedneeday in Athens, Ga. Caldwell championships, which began Wednesday in Athens, Ga. Caldwell, the eighth seed in the 64-man bracket, played Florida's Jason Appel in the first round. Unseeded Morrow took on the No. 2 seed, Mahesh Bhupathi of Mississippi. The tandem was also a top 8 seed in the doubles bracket, where they play UCLA's Robert Janecek and Eric Lin today.

### **Caldwell Earns More Plaudits**

UNC junior David Caldwell added four more awards to his already-stacked resume over the semester break.

Aready-stacked resume over the semester break. For the second consecutive year, the Richmond, Va., native was named the ACC Men's Tennis Player of the Year. Caldwell went undefeated (10-0) against conference opponents and cap-tured the No.1 singles title for the second-straight year. He is the fourth successive Tar Heel to win the title, as Bryan Jones gamered the award in 1992 and Roland Thornqvist woni tin 1993. Caldwell and his doubles partner, Brint Morrow, were also named to the league's 13-member all-conference team. The duo, which is 25-9 in doubles action, is ranked 11 th nationally. It is their second-straight appearance on the All-ACC team. Caldwell also won the Rafael Osuna Sportsmanship Award, given by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association. He is the third Tar Heel to earn the award in the past four years, as Thornqvist received the honor in 1992 and 1993. Finally, Caldwell was named the Region II recipient of the Arthur Ashe, Jr. Leadership and Sportsmanship Award. He is one

Arthur Ashe, Jr. Leadership and Sportsmanship Award. He is one of eight awardees from across the country who will be considered for the national award, which will be given at the Rolex All-Star Luncheon in New York in September.

UNC-Charlotte Coach Declines Head Hoops Job at Golden State

THE ASSOCIATED PRESS CHARLOTTE — Jeff Mullins turned down the opportunity to coach the Golden State Warriors in the NBA Monday, the North Carolina-Charlotte coach has confirmed

Mullins withdrew his name from consideration after discussions with his fam-

ily. "It was flattering and somewhat tempt-ing," Mullins told The Gaston Gazette earlier this week.

"In the past I would have said no be-cause of all the travel and the fact that you're away from your family. "This time made me think a little bit more because my daughters are grown and

working." Mullins, 53, received a phone call from Warriors owner Chris Cohan last month after Cohan consulted with Dave Twardzik, whom the Warriors hired as their general manager last Friday. Twardzik, who had been the Charlotte

Hornets' director of player personnel the last four years, is a longtime friend of Mullins

The Warriors have been searching for a coach since Don Nelson resigned under pressure in the midst of a tumultuous sea-

This year featured a standoff between Nelson and forward Chris Webber and a hospital stay for the head coach. The team

was also plagued by injuries. Although Bob Lanier completed the season on an interim basis, Cohan has shown interest in Boston's Chris Ford and former Portland coach Rick Adelman After a stellar career at Duke in which

the Blue Devils made back-to-back Final The Blue Devils made back-to-back Final Four appearances in 1963 and 1964, Mullins went on to play 12 years in the NBA, with the old St. Louis Hawks from 1964-66 and for San Francisco/Golden

State from 1966-1976. Mullins capped his career by leading Golden State to the NBA championship in 1975 and a runner-upfinishin 1976. Mullins retired with 13,017 points and a career scoring average of 16.2 points per game.

He is also a member of the Warriors' He is also a member of the warnors Hall of Fame. Mullins has spent the last 10 years as the 49ers coach — his only college coaching job — and has compiled a 168-127 record. He's taken UNC-Charlotte to

postseason tournaments five times—three years in the NCAA tournament and two years in the National Invitation Tourna ment.

# **TV Station: Wright Made Other Slurs**

PORTLAND, Ore. — CBS golf com-mentator Ben Wright, who became emnucleator ben wngin, who became em-broiled in a controversy when he was quoted in a newspaper about LPGA play-ers, called golfer Jumbo Ozakia "Jap" four years ago during a USA Network broad-cast. KOIN-TV, the CBS affiliate in Portcast. KOHV-IV, the CBS annuale in For-land, broadcast a tape Monday night from the CBS-produced coverage of the first round of the 1991 Masters in which Wright says: "Former champions aplenty, Watson and Nicklaus at 4-under with the Jap Ozaki,

who is striking a blow for the foreigners." Wright was quoted Friday by The News Journal of Wilmington as saying the LPGA had trouble drawing sponsors because of lesbianism on the tou

He also was quoted as saying women don't play as well as men because their

"boobs" hamper their backswing. Wright issued a terse denial that he ever made derogatory statements about the LPGA tour to Journal reporter Valerie Helmbreck.

Helmbreck. Wright also insisted he related to the reporter a story by Hall of Famer JoAnne Carner and never used the word "boobs." The original story also said Wright used the word 'butch' to describe lesbians on the tour. But Wright said Helmbreck inquired about the 'big butch girls' on the tour — he did not volunteer the phrase. David Kenin, president of CBS sports, said in a senarate statement: "I am con-

said in a separate statement: "I am con vinced that the offensive statements attrib uted to Mr. Wright were not made.'
