

# Documentary to Jazz Up Durham Movie Fare

Art Kane's legendary 1958 Esquire photograph of 57 jazz greats assembled in front of a Harlem brownstone is the most famous photograph of jazz musicians ever taken. Musicians in the photograph include Charles Mingus, Dizzy Gillespie, Coleman Hawkins and Roy Eldridge.

This photograph is the focus of Jean Bach's Oscar-nominated film documentary "A Great Day in Harlem," which will show at the Carolina Theatre in Durham this weekend.

The film centers around an era of jazz music and the musicians who made it. Bach, a 76-year-old first-time director, said she had always loved the photograph.

"My former husband had it (the photograph) hanging on the wall, and I had always marvelled at it and all the important people in it," Bach said. "My husband died in 1985, and then in 1989 I learned that there was some home movie footage of some of the musicians. That is how I got the idea that it would make a great documentary. My original vision was that I was going to do a scholarly research thing, but it would have been dull had I done it myself. I had been working for many months before Robert Altman's wife, Kathryn, persuaded me to get some professional help."

When Bach began doing research and interviews for the documentary, only about 20 musicians from the photograph were still alive. Of those 20, she interviewed 18, and five have died since the film's original release, including Lawrence Brown and Roy Eldridge. Bach spent years researching and conducting the interviews because of the large number of musicians in the photograph and the difficulty in finding

each of the survivors.

"I knew all those people and all I had to do was find them," Bach said. "Some lived in Europe and California; I had to go to Chicago to get Bud Freeman. I got each of the interviews differently," she said. "I had to get Dizzy Gillespie out of the dentist's chair in Manhattan."

The film runs at about one hour but an additional hour of footage was edited out during its original release. Bach said she hoped to release the film in a multi-media version on a compact disc in the near future.

Bach will appear tonight at 7 p.m. at the Carolina Theatre prior to the screening of

the film and will remain after the showing to answer questions from the audience. She will also appear at the 1:30 p.m. screening on Saturday and will speak to students from Duke University and the Triangle area. "A Great Day in Harlem" will be available on Capital City/ABC video cassette Nov. 7.

# Town Square Heels Club Kicks Back, Do-Si-Dos

While the idea of "swing your partner round and round" may sound hokey to some, members of the Square Heels Club take their square dancing seriously.

And they are inviting any and all interested members of the community to discover the art and tradition of square dancing.

There is an open house tonight at 8 p.m. at the Chapel Hill Senior Center for anyone interested in joining the group.

Newcomers need not be intimidated by a lack of square dancing experience; co-President Barbara Bibb of Chapel Hill said the club was designed for people of all different levels of experience.

Lessons for beginners will start on Sept. 22 and last from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Classes build on each other, and steps learned in one lesson are carried over into the next week's lesson, Bibb said.

Marie Bigelow, a Durham resident and club member, said she enjoyed the wide variety of people that attend the club's functions.

"We have people from all walks of life: singles and students and married couples," Bigelow said. "We have all ages, from 10 years old, to people in their 70s."

Bibb said that, in the past, students were active members of the club, but presently

the club had no student members.

"In general, square dancers tend to be middle-aged," Bibb said. "But younger people have a good time too."

The Square Heels have been in existence for almost 30 years and maintain a standing membership this year of 113 people.

Members of the club include residents of Pittsboro, Cary, Mebane, Durham, and Graham.

Active members dance every Friday after the lessons from 8:30 to 10 p.m.

Jenny Baker, a club member from Chapel Hill, enjoys square dancing as an inexpensive entertainment.

"Dues are only \$10 per person per month," Baker said.

Baker said she enjoyed the fun, fellowship and family atmosphere that the club provided as well.

"I like it because I can go out there and square dance and I don't have to worry about the pressures of drinking," she said.

The format of the lessons is quite similar to that of the regular club social dance gatherings, Bibb said.

Dancers follow the instructions of the caller, who also serves as the teacher of the lessons.

Beginners are taught about 150 moves to reach a common level, Bibb said.

Square dancing is a universal activity, Bibb said. "People all over the world square dance, and everyone dances to English," she said.

The Square Heels have enjoyed dancing with exchange students from Germany and France.

"Square dancing is tremendously popular," Bigelow said. "Almost every town or city in the United States has a club, which can be located using a detailed directory."

hours of community service a year, and in return they receive a stipend of more than \$4,000 and a monetary award to be used toward educational expenses.

Members say the project has been a tremendous success. AmeriCorps gave \$320,000 to SCALE. College campuses received \$250,000 of this money directly.

If the current political climate in the Senate is any indication, SCALE could be

facingsome substantial funding cuts during the next academic year. Despite the cut in federal funds, SCALE will try, at some level, to maintain a direct service project.

The organization will sponsor its second national conference, Partnerships for Power, which will be held in Chapel Hill from March 29-31. Kelly Collings, development and national conference director, said the theme of partnership recognized the relationship between the tutors and new readers; SCALE and college campuses; and literacy and social justice.
