Graham left his position as system president in 1949 when N.C. Gov. Kerr Scott appointed him to the U.S. Senate, a position vacated due to the death of Melville Broughton. In 1950, President Harry S

Truman appointed him to the United Nations. As a representative, Graham successfully negotiated the India-Pakistan dispute over Kashmir. Hooker said he noticed similarities and differences between circumstances surrounding Graham's era and those enveloping current times.

"The state is much more wired," Hooker said. "It is no longer a sleepy agrarian state, but we are poised for another period of revolutionary change that is much like Dr. Frank's era. We are in a transition from an energy-based economy to a knowledge-based economy." Graham's willingness to make sacri-

fices for the welfare of the state and the University are important elements that modern leaders of public universities should exhibit, Hooker said. "We need a renewed commitment of the state to education," Hooker said. "Graham extended his influence of education throughout North Carolina. The boundary of the state, too. It's hard to remember that we are serving the state, which should be the over-guiding principle."

Friday said he felt Graham's impact on Hooker's administrative and educational philosophies would become evident in the near future.

"He (Hooker) is an inspired pupil of Dr. Graham," Friday said. "During the course of his administration, you will be able to see (Dr. Graham's) influence more and more."

North Carolinians Prepared For 'United We Stand America' Party

RALEIGH — Texas billionaire Ross Perot is trying to start a third party, and North Carolina seems to be fertile ground.

In 1992, Perot supporters in the state easily passed a 70,543-signature requirement to get his name on the presidential ballot.

They collected 175,813 names in just four months. Perot then got 13.7 percent of 2.6 million votes cast.

On Sept. 25, Herbert Drew, who leads Perot's United We Stand America organization in North Carolina, asked the state

Board of Elections to reserve two possible names for a future political party in the state—the Reform Party and the Independence Party.

Perot appeared on CNN's "Larry King Live" that evening to announce the formation of the Independence Party. In a news release, Drew stresses "there is no authorized petition drive in progress for North Carolina at this time" for getting the Independence Party on the ballot.

But at least one effort, apart from those of United We Stand, is being launched in Raleigh.
