Furyk Wins First PGA Title

LAS VEGAS - Jim Furyk, who last year let the tournament get away from him in the final round, came through Sunday with birdies on the 15th and 16th holes to win the Las Vegas Invitational by a shot

over Billy Mayfair. Furyk, a second-year pro with an unorthodox swing and sweet putter, captured his first PGA Tour victory with a 5-underpar 67 on the same course where he led after four rounds of his rookie season only to finish fifth.

Furyk broke a tie with Mayfair with a 15-foot birdie putt on the 15th hole, then two-putted for birdie on the par-5 16th to take a lead he never relinquished. Mayfair birdied the 18th hole, but that still left him a stroke behind


