Furyk Wins First PGA Title

LAS VEGAS — Jim Furyk, who last year let the tournament get away from him in the final round, came through Sunday with birdies on the 15th and 16th holes to win the Las Vegas Invitational by a shot over Billy Mayfair.

Furyk, a second-year pro with an unorthodox swing and sweet putter, captured his first PGA Tour victory with a 5-under-par 67 on the same course where he led after four rounds of his rookie season only to finish fifth.

Furyk broke a tie with Mayfair with a 15-foot birdie putt on the 15th hole, then two-putted for birdie on the par-5 16th to take a lead he never relinquished. Mayfair birdied the 18th hole, but that still left him a stroke behind.

that's his way to do it."

Midnight Madness was the official beginning of the 1995-96 hoops practice season. Under NCAA rules, coaches cannot have contact with the full team until Oct. 15.

Midnight Madness has grown into a social event. It is a chance for students and fans to get their first look at the team and also offers a rare glimpse into the practice regimen of the Tar Heels.

"Some of the drills we do every day," said senior guard Dante Calabria. "We have a lot of other things we do, too, so this is a real, real abbreviated way to show everybody what we do."

According to Smith, Midnight Madness is exciting from a fan's standpoint but not necessarily from a coach's.

"We got that out of the way, and we can now go ahead and start building this team," he said. "They were tight on their shots, which I expected, and couldn't concentrate. We had these 50-minute workouts, and certain things that they learned there they didn't exhibit, because they were worrying about how they looked."

"If you're a teacher in a classroom, you wouldn't like to have 10,000 people watching. You don't want to get on anybody. It's perfectly quiet other than their talking on defense in a regular practice. They can hear me."

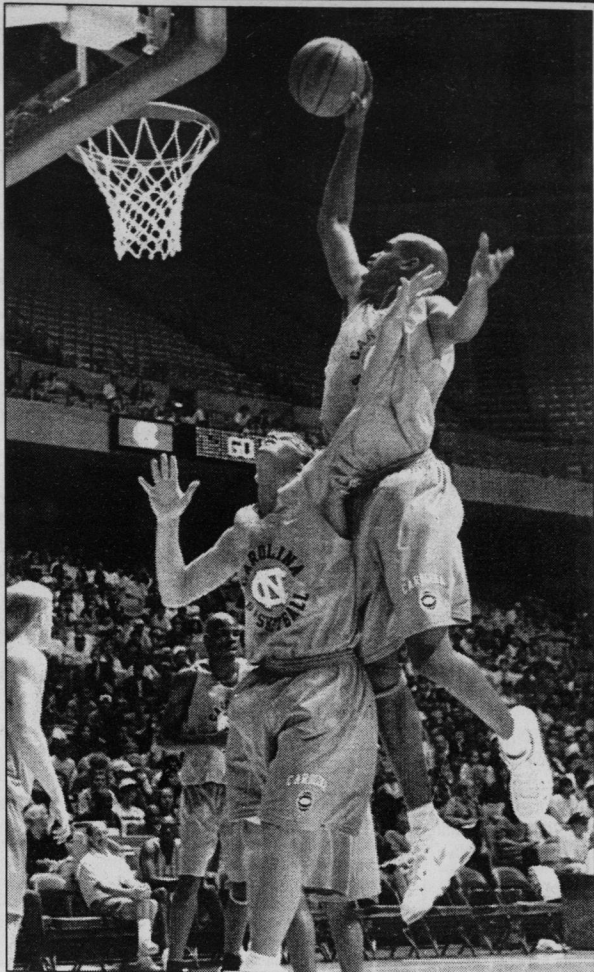
Smith said Midnight Madness is held with the fans in mind, and the support they showed Saturday night is the reason it keeps going.

"We really appreciate our student body," he said. "They wanted this, and they certainly supported it. I think they'll be with this team win or lose as long as they play hard and play together."

"It really is great to see a crowd come out. It's very satisfying to support this team, and they know it won't be easy this year, and I think they'll be behind us all year."

However, Smith said Midnight Madness won't be held every season. If the start of practice falls on a weekday, Smith won't hold a midnight workout.

"We aren't going to do it, I've already

its vaunted pass rush.

"Where we messed up as a defense, we kept letting them get second-and-six, second-and-five," UNC linebacker Brian Simmons said. "That helped them to be able to open up the offense."

It was UNC's defense that looked wide open to Tech's backs. Williams rushed for 108 yards on 30 carries, while Wiley gained 99 yards on 18 carries.

But it was Davis' two late first-half scrampers that set the tone for Tech's 150 yards on the ground in the second half.

With the Jackets driving, and time winding down, Davis rushed on consecutive plays for 35 yards, taking his team to UNC's 29. Four plays later, Tech scored to capture the lead, which they never relinquished.

"I think that was a gutsy call—the draw call," Davis said. "That just shows a lot of faith that the coaches have in me, because it got things rolling."

"I'm not a C.J. Williams or a Charles Wiley, but it's getting there."

From there, the Jackets simply ran at UNC, as Davis attempted only six passes in the second half.
