Mexican, East Indian, Italian and American food are some of the many cul-

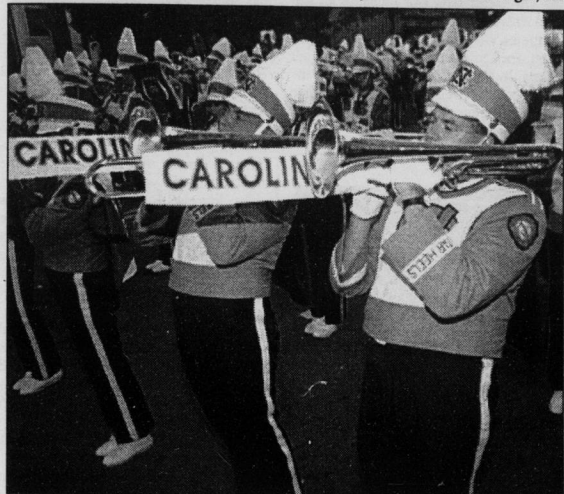
