Two-thirds of the decision will be based on student votes, and the other third will be based on the application and the interview.

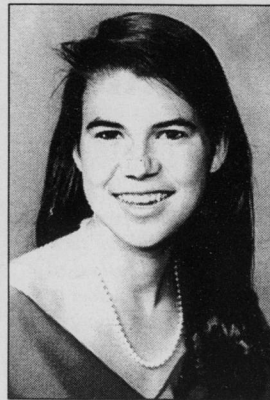
The seven women nominated for Homecoming queen are:

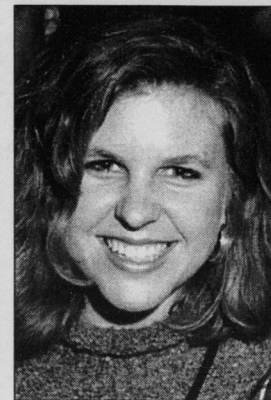

"It helps me keep my faith strong," she said. "In college, that can be hard to do."

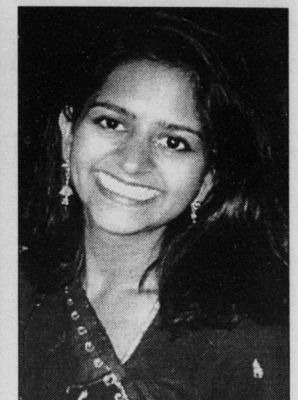
