Bradley Wins Golf Tourney

UNC's Rob Bradley fired a 1-under par 71 to finish with a three-day score of 210 to win the individual title at the Jerry Pate Intercollegiate Golf Tournament Tuesday in Birmingham, Ala.

Sunday, Bradley shot a 7-under par 65 to take the lead; Monday, he maintained the top spot with a 2-over par 74.

Arizona State's Chris Hanell finished three shots behind Bradley for second place. UNLV's Chris Riley finished third.

For UNC, Mark Wilson tied for 12th with a three-day total of 223. Whit Stapetes tied for 21st with a 225; Lee McEntee finished 50th with a 232; and Greg DiDonna finished tied for 51st with a 233. Arizona State won with a team total 882. The Tar Heels tied for fourth, seven strokes back.

Nebraska Tailback Cleared By Coach to Play Football

LINCOLN, Neb. — Six weeks after he was dismissed from the team for hitting a former girlfriend, Nebraska tailback Lawrence Phillips returned to practice Tuesday and is expected to play Nov. 4 against Iowa State.

Phillips, a junior from West Covina, Calif., had not practiced since Sept. 10, when he was arrested for hitting Kate McEwen, a 20-year-old Nebraska basketball player, at the apartment of quarterback Scott Frost. Police said McEwen was dragged down a flight of stairs.

Phillips did not speak to reporters as he reported for practice. However, he released a statement Tuesday.

"I'm sorry that this happened," Phillips said. "I know I can't undo the situation, but I'm trying to learn from it."

"I haven't run from the problem but I am facing it head on. I have taken all the necessary steps toward returning to the team and will continue my counseling and will follow the sanctions determined by the university."

Coach Tom Osborne said Phillips would not travel with No. 2 Nebraska (7-0, 3-0 Big Eight) for Saturday's game at No. 7 Colorado. But Osborne said Phillips would suit up against Iowa State the following week.

Field Hockey to Honor Schroll, Continue Streak on Senior Day

Today marks two important lasts for the UNC field hockey team — the last home game of the season, and Kimberly Schroll's last regular-season game in Chapel Hill.

Schroll will be honored tonight by her teammates at Navy Field for Senior Day. The team's lone senior and team captain, she has led the Tar Heels to a perfect 16-0 record this season going into tonight's game against Duke at 7:30.

"Kim is definitely a great leader for us," sophomore forward Kate Barbers said. "She is a great motivator for us and on and off the field. She really keeps our team together and is the epitome of a leader. She is a great player and she gives it all she's got out on

the field."

The defining moment of Schroll's leadership this year came against Maryland Oct. 14, when she scored in sudden-death overtime, ending what has been the most competitive game of the season and maintaining the Tar Heels' win streak.

A Tar Heel win would mark the 32nd consecutive time UNC has defeated Duke. Coach Karen Shelton has not suffered a loss to Duke since 1981, her first

year at the helm of the field hockey program in Chapel Hill.

"We have to be confident going into every game," Barbers said. "Being that they are Duke, we can't take them lightly. They have a great team, one of the best teams they have had in a while and we can't overlook them."

The Tar Heels blanked the Blue Devils in Durham earlier this season, 3-0.

The unranked Blue Devils are 8-9 this season and 1-5 in the ACC. Schroll said, "It is a huge game for them, and it is going to be big for us, because every time we play they give us a tough time."

Women's, Men's Soccer Play Doubleheader at Fetzer Field

The UNC men's and women's soccer teams play their second doubleheader of the season at Fetzer Field tonight with the women playing at 5 and the men at 7.

In the opener, the No. 1 ranked women's team (18-0) plays its last regular season home game against Radford (4-10-1).

The Tar Heels are riding a 28-game winning streak, and they have clinched the ACC regular season title and the No. 1 seed in next weekend's ACC Tournament.

Meanwhile, Radford has lost five of its last six games, and has managed only 24 goals this season, which is eight less than the total of UNC's top two scorers, Debbie Keller and Robin Confer.

With two assists against Virginia Sunday, Keller moved into a tie for ninth place

in career assists at UNC with 39, and is two points shy of eighth place in overall scoring.

The defense has been just as dominating. UNC has given up only five goals this season, and goalies Tracy Noonan and Siri Mullinix have combined for 13 shutouts.

And in a 10-day stretch of six games that ended Sunday, the Tar Heels allowed only three goals, and five of those teams were ranked in the top 25.

In the nightcap, the UNC men's team (9-5-1) faces Appalachian State (9-7) in its last non-conference game this season.

After struggling through a four-game losing streak, the Tar Heels have not lost in their last four games, and earned their first point in the ACC Sunday with a tie against N.C. State.

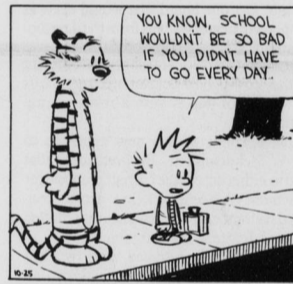
But that tie cost UNC, as top scorer Temoc Suarez will be unable to play tonight because he received his fifth yellow card against State and must miss one game. Without Suarez's 19 points, his brother Victor becomes the leading scorer on the roster with six goals and 14 points.

The Mountaineers are led by forward Jay Lane, who has eight goals and 17 points, and Kevin Turner, who has six goals and 15 points.

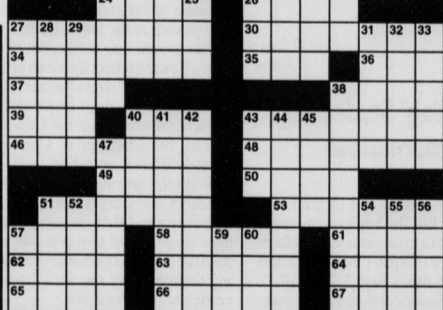
