even greater impact on the lives of disadvantaged youths and the communities which are in need of help and hope," the release states.

Despite rumors that the Jordan Foundation would donate money to the Black Cultural Center, BCC officers said they were not disappointed with Jordan's probable support for the Institute of Families.

"There was never any outright promise by Michael Jordan to give money to the

BCC," said Ellington Graves, program coordinator for the BCC.

The Charlotte office, which announced its closing Friday, plans to continue supporting organizations allotted funds for this year. Benefield said she was optimistic about the support of the Jordan family. "Nothing is yet firm, but we are looking forward to their continued involvement," she said.

Deloris Jordan was unavailable for comment at press time. Representatives from the Charlotte office declined to discuss details of the closing.

Until this season, the NCAA required that the host site give each participating school 250 tickets. Even though that amount has been raised, it still causes problems when first-round sites are played at small arenas — such as the Richmond Coliseum, which seats only 12,500.

"(The ticket problem) very seldom happens because it's not often that we play so close to home," Smith said.

Last year, the Educational Foundation was allotted between 110 and 120 tickets to

UNC's first-round site in Tallahassee, Fla. When the Tar Heels played in Winston-Salem in 1993, however, the foundation was allotted only seven tickets.

"We usually end up with what's left over at the end," Smith said.

cal specialty ranked second. The user-interaction graphics area of computer science tied for second with Brown University and Carnegie Mellon University.

Doctoral science programs were evaluated on scholarship, curriculum and quality of faculty and graduate students.

"Those are strong rankings," Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences Stephen Birdsall said. "I think they show the excellent value and the quality these units offer

Birdsall also pointed out that the same faculty members who taught in the graduate programs in the chemistry, biology and computer science departments also taught undergraduate students.

Two other schools, the School of Education and the School of Law, ranked in the top 40.

While the School of Education placed 32nd overall, a reputable survey of school superintendents placed it sixth.

The law school placed 34th overall, but it ranked 19th in a survey of lawyers and judges.
