





Going into the NCAA tournament, Duncan is averaging 19.6 points and 12.3 rebounds per game. He led the ACC in rebounding and blocked shots for the second season, in addition to compiling a

league-high 20 double-doubles.
Duncan is the school's all-time leader in blocked shots and became the first player in Wake Forest history to record three successive seasons of 100 blocked shots apiece. When it came time for the ACC tournament, Duncan enhanced his resume.
Duncan grabbed 56 rebounds — he had

22 rebounds against Georgia Tech—over three tournament games, breaking the mark of 54 set by N.C. State's Dickie Hemric in the 1955 ACC tournament. He also scored 68 points, including 27 in the title game.


