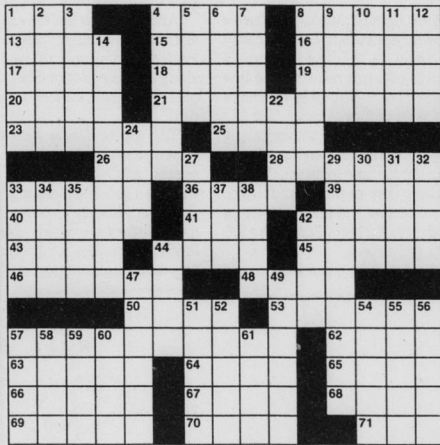

Duncan Named ACC Player of Year

WINSTON-SALEM — Tim Duncan, the Wake Forest center who made life almost impossible for opponents in the paint this season, was named ACC 1996 player of the year Monday by The Associated Press. The 6-foot-11 junior captured the award in a runaway vote by the Atlantic Coast Sports Writers Association. Duncan had 88 votes out of 107 ballots cast for the honor before and during the ACC tournament. N.C. State center Todd Fuller was second with 14. The remaining five votes went to Georgia Tech players. Matt Harpring got four votes and Stephon

Marbury, who is also a candidate for ACC rookie of the year, got one. "I worked hard this season, and that's just a fulfillment of the whole thing," Duncan said Monday. "I guess I couldn't do this without my coaches and my team, and they're the people that I have to thank for this." Going into the NCAA tournament, Duncan is averaging 19.6 points and 12.3 rebounds per game. He led the ACC in rebounding and blocked shots for the second season, in addition to compiling a

league-high 20 double-doubles. Duncan is the school's all-time leader in blocked shots and became the first player in Wake Forest history to record three successive seasons of 100 blocked shots apiece. When it came time for the ACC tournament, Duncan enhanced his resume. Duncan grabbed 56 rebounds — he had 22 rebounds against Georgia Tech — over three tournament games, breaking the mark of 54 set by N.C. State's Dickie Hemric in the 1955 ACC tournament. He also scored 68 points, including 27 in the title game.
