

Turnbull Out For Year After Breaking Ankle

CHARLOTTEVILLE, Va. — The North Carolina men's lacrosse team suffered a blow Friday evening against Duke when attackman Merrill Turnbull went down with 3:27 left in the first half.

Turnbull injured his right ankle as he attempted to curl around the goal. It was later determined that Turnbull had broken his ankle, ending his season. The junior from Mahopac, N.Y., had three goals and two assists against the Blue Devils before he succumbed to the injury.

Also against Duke, UNC sophomore midfielder Mike Maier left the game with a sprained right ankle. He was able to play in Sunday's title game against Virginia.

ing save to keep UNC's hopes up and Virginia within striking distance.

"We had some good chances, but their goalie played very, very well," Virginia coach Dom Starsia said.

In the second half, Brown and his cohorts were faced with a different scenario. This time, they were the ones having to protect the lead, a tall order to fill against the likes of Knight and Whiteley.

But just as he did in the second period, Brown answered the call and surrendered only four second-half goals to the relentless UVA. attackers.

"I knew they were going to shoot — they're always coming at you," Brown said. "When we went to zone, they were taking a lot of shots from 15 yards out. I've got to make those saves, or I'm coming out of the game."

goal of the period — senior middle Rob Tobin found Phillips streaking through the Wahoo defense for another score, and at the half, UNC had forged a 7-7 tie.

"We were real confident at halftime," Collins said. "We knew it would start going for us — it was just a matter of when it would happen and who it was going to be."

The Tar Heels scored three quick goals (Tobin, Phillips, Ryan Beard) to open the second half and continued to harass UVA. with their suffocating help defense. Knight cut the UNC lead to 10-8 at the 8:34 mark with a desperate rush to the front of the goal, but Phillips answered, scooping up a loose ball 15 yards away and firing it past Sanderson for an 11-8 UNC lead.

Knight kept the Cavs close with his fourth goal at the 14:52 mark of the third. But with 13:37 left to go in the game, Knight collided with Tar Heel defenseman

Following the contest, Shelton, Kubin and sophomore Brandy Arthur were named to the all-tournament team.

Earlier in the day, North Carolina topped Maryland 3-1 to avenge a 3-0 loss to the Terps in the first round.

With the score tied at one in the top of the fourth, Kubin sent a Kelly Shipman pitch into center field for an RBI single, scoring Arthur and giving UNC a 2-1 lead.

On the mound, Shelton shut down the Maryland batters with a three-hit, six strikeout performance.

Tar Heels Bodevil Duke

Wade scored six goals and UNC connected on six of its 15 shots in the first quarter to paste Duke on Friday.

Wade connected on two goals, Turnbull turned a hat trick and Tobin scored in the first period to put the game well out of Duke's reach.

In Saturday's first game, UNC's offense tattered the Virginia pitching staff with a 10-hit performance, blasting the Cavaliers 8-0 in only six innings of play.

Leading 4-0 in the top of the sixth, Arthur hit a bases-loaded triple to right field, scoring three runs to blow the game open. Lorin Slade followed with a single to score Arthur and put UNC up 8-0.

Friday's first-round game against Maryland was marked by Shipman's strong pitching. After hurling a shutout vs. Virginia the night before, Shipman victimized the Tar Heel batters, allowing only one hit in seven scoreless innings in the 3-0 victory.

second- and third-place finishes.

For the women, senior All-American Kim Jones was runner-up in the high jump.

Senior Monique Hunt finished second in the 800, and senior Tyra Moore settled for second in the triple jump after winning the event for the past two years.

Freshman Nicole Gamble placed third in the triple jump.

For the Tar Heel men, junior Tony McCall finished second in the 100 meters, and sophomore Eric Bishop was second in the high jump.

The men's 4x400 relay team was runner-up, and Marcus Stokes was second in the 110 hurdles.

Junior Jerry Bright finished third in the shot put. Senior Maurice Smith was third in the triple jump. Quick (100 meters and 200 meters), Hennagan (400), Colander (100-meter hurdles), Christopher (triple jump) and McCall (100 meters and 200 meters) have all posted NCAA automatic qualification standards for the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

The championship meet will be held May 29-June 1 in Eugene, Ore.

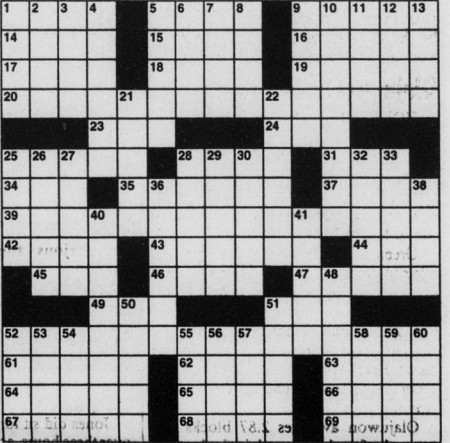
