Tar Heels fail to move forward in Associated Press rankings

in the Tar Heels' 16-0 victory over Georgia Tech Saturday at Kenan Stadium, the shutout wasn't impressive enough to move UNC up in the polls.

Sunday's Associated Press Top 25 ranked the Tar Heels 11th, the same as last week's poll: "We're really not considering the polls,"

Tar Heel receiver Na Brown said Saturday. "We just want to go out every time and do



into the Top 25 at No. 23 on Sept. 1 after it whipped Clemson 45-0. Then, following the Tar Heels' 27-10 win at Syracuse on Sept. 7, UNC jumped to No. 13.

In 1993, UNC was 3-0 and ranked 13th when it squared off against top-rated Florida State in Chapel Hill.

And when the Tar Heels roll into Tallahassee, Fla., Saturday to tussle with the Seminoles, the circumstances will be much the same as in '93. No. 11 UNC is again 3-0, and the 'Noles are second in AP Football Top 25


