STRAIGHT PARTY VOTING

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER

a. To Vote for all candidates of one party (a straight ticket), complete the arrow to the right of the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.

b. You may vote a split ticket by not completing the party arrow, but by completing the arrow to the right of the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.

c. You may also vote a split ticket by completing the party arrow and then completing the arrow the right of the name of any candidate you choose of a different party. In any

multi-seat race where a party arrow is marked and you vote for candidates of another party, you must complete the arrow to the right of any candidate you choose of the party for which you completed the party arrow to assure your vote will count.

d. If you tear or deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it and get another.

e. Straight party voting includes both sides of the ballot, except the Soil Conservation and Bond Referendum Ballot which must be marked separately.

The issuance of nine hundred fifty million dollars (\$950,000,000) State of North Carolina Highway Bonds constituting general obligation bonds of the State secured by a pledge of the faith and credit and taxing power of the State for the purpose of providing funds, through the application of not in excess of five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000) of the bonds to pay the capital costs of Intrastate System projects, and the application of not in excess of one hundred fifty million dollars (\$150,000,000) of the bonds to pay the capital costs of projects constituting a part of the State secondary highway system resulting in the paving of unpaved roads.

Heineman, Price face each other in House rematch

■ Rep. Fred Heineman, R-N.C., is seeking a return trip to Washington.

Republican incumbent Fred Heineman again faces Democrat David Price, whom he defeated by 1,215 votes in the 1994 election.

William Knight, chairman of the Orange County Republican Party, said this election would depend on voter turnout.

"I don't think the issues are going to have anything to do with it," Knight said. "The crux of it is going to come down to who gets the vote out."

Heineman, an ex-Marine and a law enforcement officer for 39 years, served as Raleigh police chief before his election and is still affectionately referred to as "the chief" by his staff and supporters.

According to Congressional Quarterly's online service, Heineman supports spending more money for prisons, limiting the number of appeals allowed for death-row inmates, and increasing penalties for illegal drugs and for possession of illegal firearms. Heineman opposes abortion except in cases of rape, incest or danger to the mother's life.

A self-styled fiscal conservative, Heineman supported the balanced-budget amendment and wants a three-fifths majority of Congress to approve any tax increase. He has advocated allowing lower- and middle-class parents to deduct college expenses from their taxes.

■ Price said he would focus on bipartisan education and environmental reform.

David Price said he rejected partisan politics, advocated a balanced budget and would work for education and environmental reform.

"I am determined to get past partisan politics and stale ideology to seriously address this nation's challenges in balancing the budget, in education and in the environment," Price said.

"People are disgusted with the way politicians are bickering. We need to have serious debates because the issues are too important to not, but we must avoid rule-or-ruin politics."

Balancing the budget in a way that is fair and equitable to everyone is one of Price's primary goals. During his previous term in Congress, Price proposed legislation to balance the budget and wants to continue along those same lines.

"People became very skeptical of politicians after the government shut down. Politicians have an obligation to be able to say at the end of the day that they have delivered results to the American people."

Price has vowed to protect the student loan program and to give additional tax credits for families to pay for college educations. He also said he wanted to improve the community college system.

"Education is far and away one of the most important issues to people in this district," he said.
