Soccer falls to Deacons in overtime loss at ACCs

STAFF REPORT The North Carolina men's soccer team was eliminated from the ACC tournament quarterfinals on Thursday, falling 1-0 to Wake Forest in overtime. The loss almost definitely crushes any hopes the sixth-seeded Tar Heels (8-8-1) had of reaching the NCAA tournament. The Deacons (12-6-1) notched the game's only score during the 109th minute when Wake's Josh Timbers booted a penalty kick by UNC goalkeeper William Woodruffe. "I just picked my side and dove," Woodruffe said. "He had a great strike and put it past me." Once again, the Tar Heels were marred by failing to capitalize on their chances.

UNC dominated the match and substituted only once because of the rhythm it had established. But even though North Carolina outshot the Deacs 15-13, they dropped their third overtime contest of the year. Tar Heel midfielder Temoc Suarez took eight of those shots but couldn't find the back of the net in the losing effort.

Analysis/Prediction: UNC hasn't won in Charlottesville, Va., since 1981 — a streak it has a legitimate shot of breaking this season. Why? Pure, unadulterated desire. The Tar Heels are sick of hearing about the streak, plus the only way UNC will be up for Alliance Bowl consideration come December is if it wins out — meaning a victory at Scott Stadium. To win, the Tar Heels must contain Wahoo tailback Tiki Barber, no light task considering he's posted 18 100-yard games in his career. UVa. has the edge in special teams, meaning UNC's kickers can't feel the cold Saturday.

reer record of 24. "I think it's an outstanding defensive football team," Welsh said. "They have high rankings in the league and nationally. I think the changes they've made — the attacking style, the man-to-man style — has helped them."
What's Virginia boast? Tiki Barber. The ACC Player of the Year prospect posted back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons in 1995 and '96 and is on pace for the same feat this year, even though he failed to gain 100 yards in a game for the first time this year against Clemson.
"I'm not sure that you can stop him; I'm not sure you can contain him," UNC coach Mack Brown said. "All you can do is try to always be aware of where he is. He's an exciting player to try to defend."
UNC enters the game favored by 3, as UVa. started the year 4-0 but are 2-3 in their last five games.
On the flip side, the Tar Heels are on a five-game roll and simply want to escape the suffocating bubble of Scott Stadium with a win.

"I told my team... one of the obvious things they would be asked about this week is the streak," Brown said. "In the opening ballgame, one of the opening focuses was that Clemson had won 13 of the last 16 times we've played them."
"So the thing that I told that team at that time was that we're a new team; we're starting over. Don't worry about the opponent, don't think about the opponent. Let's try to be the best team we can be."
Eight games later, the Tar Heels are looking to repeat that victory — and quash the streak.

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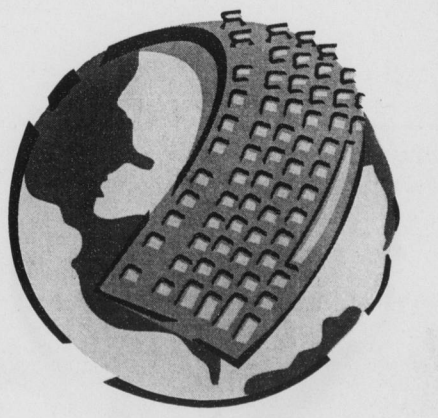
