University financial records, human resources, physical plant and University physicians, said Ken Thorn, director for data management for Administration Information Services.

"I think we are in very good shape, but we have to be careful that we do not regress," he said.

"The University is a dynamic environment, and we are continuously responding to requests for changes that need to be made to computer net-

Associate University Registrar Donna Redmon said the most significant Y2K concern for students dealt with problems that might arise with the student information system, which is based solely on computer records.

'We have done a lot of conversion on the student information system to make sure we were good-to-go with the arrival

of 2000," she said. "A lot of time and effort has gone on

to make sure we don't miss a beat."

The student information system includes admission records, financial aid records, registration records and housing records, Redmon said. Dan O'Neal, associate director for

Student Information services for Administration Information Services, said technicians had examined four million lines of computer code within the student information system since 1996.

He said the technician had developed software to convert year cod from two-digit numbers to four-digit numbers to ensure that all student information data would be interpreted cor-

O'Neal said that after conversions had been made, technicians audited the changes and declared the system as Y2K compliant.

"We actually tested the system as if it were already 2000," he said. "For exam-

ple, we simulated class registration over both the telephonic and World Wide Web sys-

Holly Hyland senior assistant director of system support for the Office

Scholarship and
Student Aid, said the financial aid aspect
of the network had also been certified as Y2K compliant.

"Students should not encounter problems in receiving their financial aid awards," she said.

Smythe said in addition to making sure major network systems were Y2K compliant, the University had educated schools and departments about the Y2K problem by developing a Year 2000 Committee and Y2K project office.

The committee consists of two full-Y2K consultants from Data Dimensions, undergraduate and graduate students and other ATN staff members, Smythe said

She said most of the problems found in academic areas had been softwarerelated, in which computer software only adapted to two-digit year codes. "When you would pass data from one program to another, the results would have been inconsistent, and arithmetic errors could occur," she said.

tions that had to be made to hardware

tions that had to be made to hardware and software on desktop computers. But many of the science departments did require some internal changes to be made on lab equipment like electron microscopes, Smythe said. Jay Aikat, the Y2K representative for the School of Journalism and Mass

Communication, said the committee pointed out several problems school officials had not seen, such as problems

with video equipment.

She said codes had to be changed on the equipment to avoid any malfunc-tions that would cause the equipment to

stop working.
"We have tried to target departments and schools where we knew from the University's inventory that there was a

lot of the equipment," Smythe said.

Pat Mullin, associate University librarian for access services and systems, said the committee had worked with the consultants to detect problems with the online catalog and library security sys-

Mullin said the online catalog system was updated to be Y2K compliant after the software company released its latest

version of the system.

"There is not one solution," Smythe said. "We are just trying to give people tools they can use to solve some of the problems they might experience."

There is not a generic system that will work for all computers.


